Mrs. Fred Horenberger was the luncheon guest of her cousin, Mrs. E. Krueger in Northbrook Friday.

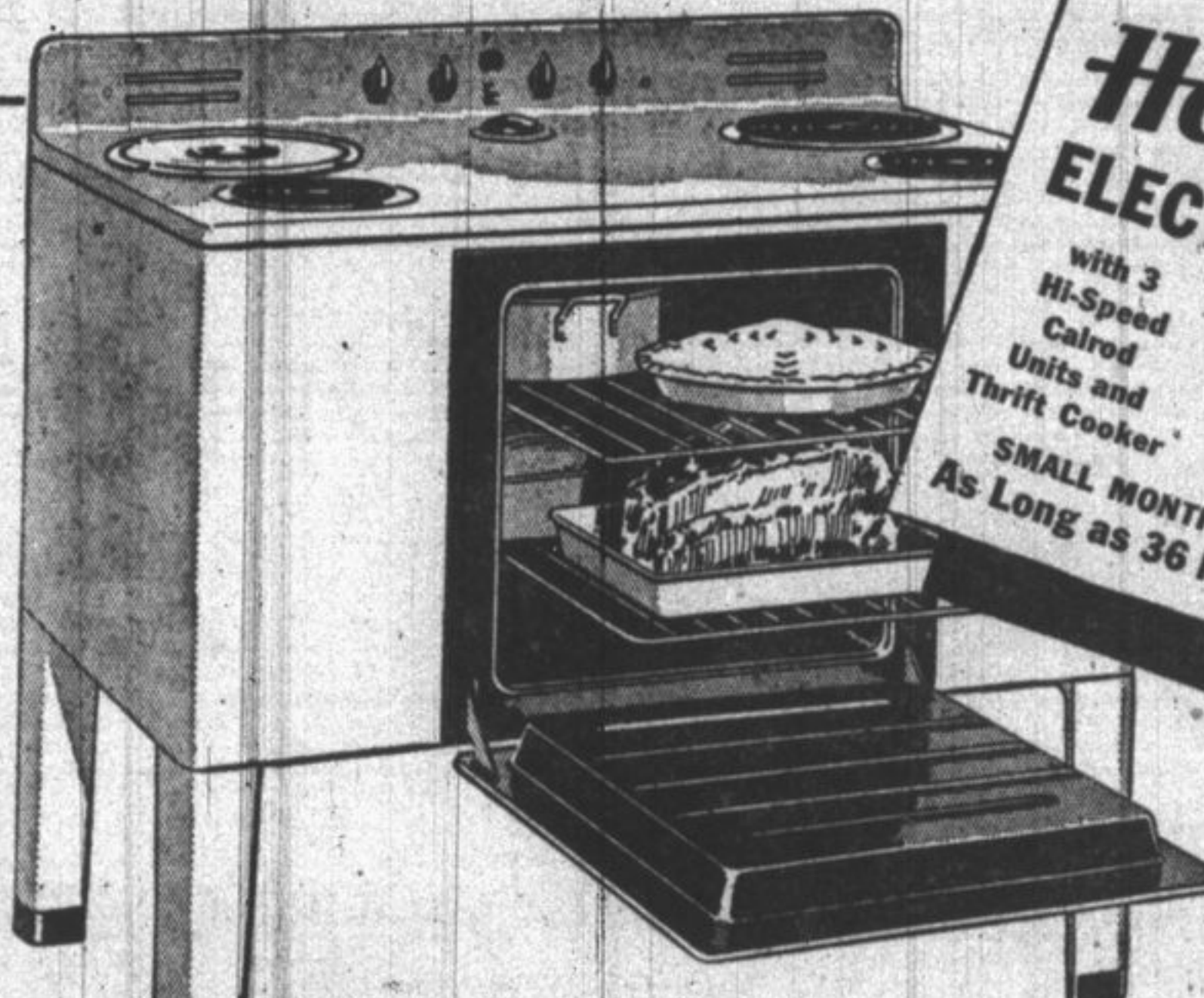
