(Continued from page 7) been improved considerably during the summer. The playgrounds have been finished with stone, gravel, and screenings so that they will not be muddy during the winter. Considerable redecorating has been done inside both buildings. A new roof has been put on the Jesse L. Smith Auditorium and the roof of the Green Road school has been repaired. Everything is in shipshape condition for the opening of school. Schools of District 108 including Ridge, Braeside, Ravinia and Lincoln will open Wednesday, Sept. 9 at 9 o'clock. The first day will be devoted to registration, organization and buying of books. This gives the parents a day after Labor Day to get back from their summer homes and holiday trips. The teaching staff will hold a general meeting at the Lincoln school on Tuesday afternoon Sept. 8, at 2:30 o'clock. This meeting will be for the purpose of organization and will give the faculty a chance to meet the new teachers.

There are a number of changes and additions to the staff this year. At Ridge there will be no changes. Miss N. Grace Wright will continue as principal and upper grade teacher. Mrs. Hazel Ringer will be primary teacher and Miss Virginia Ingram will again be an assistant. At Braeside, Miss Caroline Baker has been added to the staff in order that the first and second grades, taught last year by Miss Grace Cassell, may be divided. Miss Baker whose home is in Wilmette, is a graduate of National College of Education, Northwestern University and has had successful experience in the primary field.

Mr. Marion Whittaker of DeKalb, Illinois has been elected to succeed Mr. VanSlate as upper grade teacher of social studies and science. Mr. Whittaker is a graduate of the State Teachers College at DeKalb and has had six years of successful experience in Princeton and Western Springs. Mr. VanSlate goes to Shreveport, La., to organize and direct a new private school in that city.

Miss Wilson will continue as teacher of third and fourth grades and Miss Siverson as teacher of upper grade mathematics and spelling. Mrs. Elder, who is principal, will again teach the upper grade English.

The new addition to the Braeside school will give the necessary rooms needed to take care of the increased enrollment in this section of our district. Three class rooms and a large assembly-play room will be finished, it is hoped very soon after the opening days of school. Rapid progress with the building has been made during the summer months but it will not be completed in time for the opening week. An enlarged and improved playground will also add to the facilities of the school.

At Ravinia, Mrs. Dorothy Brown who will teach part time in Glencoe and continue her study at Northwestern will be succeeded by Ruth Heath who has taught first

grade in Ravinia for the past few years. Miss Margaret Luscombe of Gary, Indiana will take Miss Heath's place as first grade teacher. Miss Luscombe is a graduate of National College of Education and has had five years experience, three of which were spent in our neighboring school at Kenilworth. Miss Coldren, who taught kindergarten in Ravinia the last two years was married in June to Mr. Wm. Dodge of Evanston and will spend a year with her husband in Mexico. Her work will be taken over by Miss Margaret Wheelan who comes from the Shorewood Hills Kindergarten at Madison, Wis. Miss Wheelan is a graduate of Miss Woods school in Minneapolis, Minn., and has had further study at University of Wisconsin and University of Chicago. There are no other changes at Ravinia school. Mr. Allen Metcalf of Northwestern School of Music will teach band and orchestra instrument and help with orchestra and band work at all the schools. Miss Susan Hunt will also return as specialist in reading and will do special work wherever it is needed. Kindergarten will open as usual at Ravinia and Lincoln. The question of a kindergarten at Braeside is uncertain at present. Every effort will be made to provide one as soon as possible. Children must be five before January 1 in order to enroll in our kindergartens and birth certificates will be required.

Mothers will please bring them when entering the children on the first day. First grade children must be six before January 1.
