This issue will be a pot-purri of recipes... of interest to all home-makers.

Apricot Nut Bread
Wash one and one-half cups of dried apricots; let boil five minutes, drain and chop.

Cream of Broccoli Soup
Wash broccoli carefully and cut into small pieces, add water and cook until tender; use about one pound of broccoli, three cups of water, one teaspoon and one-half of salt and cook for 25 minutes, and of the water remaining reserve one cup for the soup.

Eggs with Broccoli
Hard cook eight eggs and when sufficiently cooled remove from shell. Cut them in quarters. Add one cup of broccoli, which has been cooked and cut in inch lengths. Place the eggs and broccoli in well

buttered ramekins. Pour over them white sauce (two cups will be required), sprinkle with grated cheese, top with buttered and salted crumbs and heat in a moderate oven until delicately browned.

Frozen Fruit Salad
2 slices canned pineapple (diced)
1 banana (sliced)
1/2 cup Mayonnaise
1 orange (diced)
1/2 cup maraschino cherries
1 cup sweetened whipped cream.
Moisten fruit with mayonnaise. Fold in the sweetened whipped cream. Freeze in trays of automatic refrigerator, or fill empty baking powder cans with salad, sealing with a strip of adhesive tape. Freeze three hours. Remove by running a knife around inside. Serve on lettuce, in slices. Garnish each slice with a spoonful of mayonnaise and a cherry. The cans may be packed in ice and salt if no automatic refrigerator is available.

Frozen Tomato Juice Cocktail
1 pt tomato juice
4 stalks celery (well bruised or grated)
2 teas sugar
1 tblsp grated onion
1/2 teas salt
Add other ingredients to the tomato juice. Let stand 15 minutes. Strain through a course wire sieve or a strainer. Pour into freezing tray of refrigerator. Stir several times during the freezing process. Freeze only partially. Serve in cocktail glasses.

Cabbage and Peanut Salad
1 small head of cabbage
1 teas salt
1/2 cup chopped peanuts
1/2 teas paprika
1 pimienta
Discard outside leaves of cabbage and cut head in quarters. Let stand in ice water until crisp. Drain and chop. Mix with peanuts and add salt and paprika. Serve with cooked salad dressing and garnish with strips of pimienta.
