The RECIPE BOX

So many requests for recipes I have given over the air that today again, I give you some of those that I think you will like.

Oyster Short Cake 2 cups flour 3 tbsp butter or shortening 1/2 teas sugar 4 teas baking powder 1/2 teas salt

Milk to moisten Method: First sift dry ingredients together, work the shortening into the dry ingredients and add enough milk to make a soft dough...

Oyster Filling 2 tbsp butter 1 cup milk 1 tbsp catsup or chili sauce 1 heaping tbsp flour 1 pint fresh oysters Pepper and salt

Method: Make a cream sauce of the butter, flour and milk. Add seasonings. Cook oysters in the sauce until the edges curl. Remove from heat at once.

Blue Fish with Bananas Select a four-pound blue fish, have it split and boned. Wipe dry with a damp cloth.

and parsley. Crabmeat Salad DeLuxe One can crabmeat (6 oz.) 1/2 cup blanched almonds, shaved 8 ripe olives, chopped 1/2 teas pepper 4 hard cooked eggs, sliced 1 cup celery, diced 1 teas salt

Marinate crabmeat in French dressing and chill all ingredients thoroughly. Combine them when chilled in order given. Season. Serve in nests of cold crisp lettuce. Garnish with mayonnaise over top of mound and bits of ripe olives.

Date Bars 1 cup dates 1 cup chopped nuts 2 teas baking powder 1 cup flour 3 eggs 2 tsp vanilla

Beat eggs well, add sugar and beat 2 minutes. Add dates and nuts, which have been ground together. Sift in flour with baking powder.

Fruited Swiss Steak 2 1/2 lbs round steak, cut 1 1/2 inch thick 3 cups hot water 1/2 cup cold water 1 cup whole ripe olives Salt, pepper, flour 2 teas chili powder 1 cup cooked prunes

Cut steak into pieces of desired sizes, pound well and dredge with flour, salt and pepper. Fry in small quantity of fat, until well browned on all sides.

Household Hints

Rhubarb is ideal with fish menus and when made into a hearty dessert does much to bring up the calory count of a meal.

Corned lamb is a typically Norwegian dish that has found favor among Americans. It is prepared exactly as corned beef is prepared and is equally good cold or served in a boiled dinner with vegetables.

knife (preferably a sharp one) in very hot water and cut immediately. It will not stick to the knife and the cake and marshmallows will not be smashed after cutting.

When making egg custard pies, always heat the milk to the boiling point before mixing it with the eggs. The undercrust will always be crisp.

Chervil is a pot herb you encounter in cook books but seldom see. It is allied to parsley in flavor, but liked better by many.

A teaspoonful of vinegar beaten into boiled frosting when flavoring is added will keep it from being brittle or breaking when cut.
