Rev. and Mrs. Earl J. Bruno have returned from a fortnight's visit at Lake Geneva, Wis.

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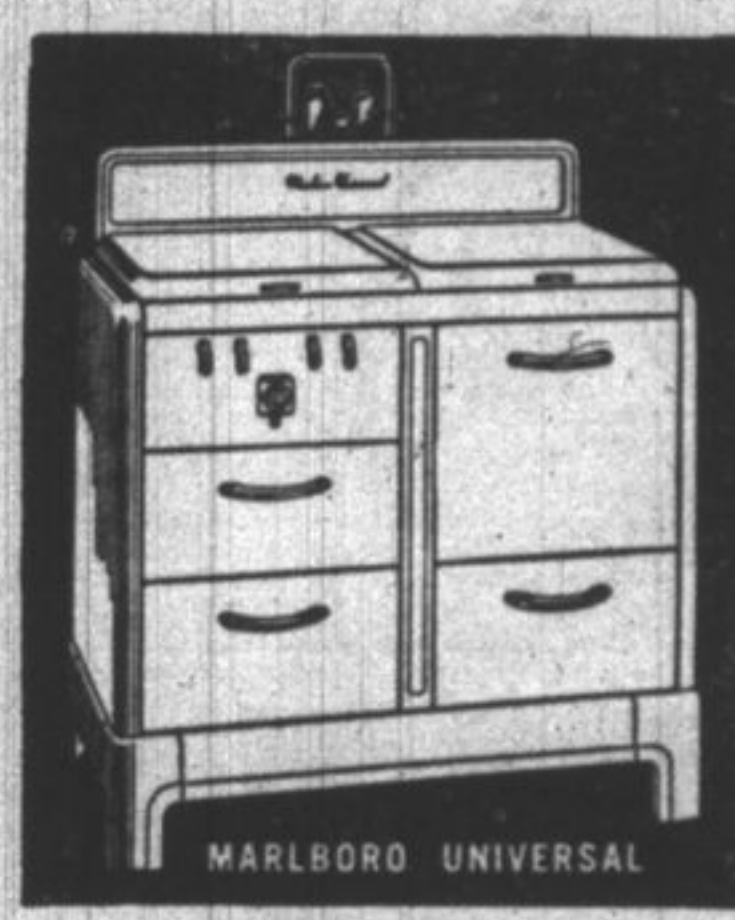
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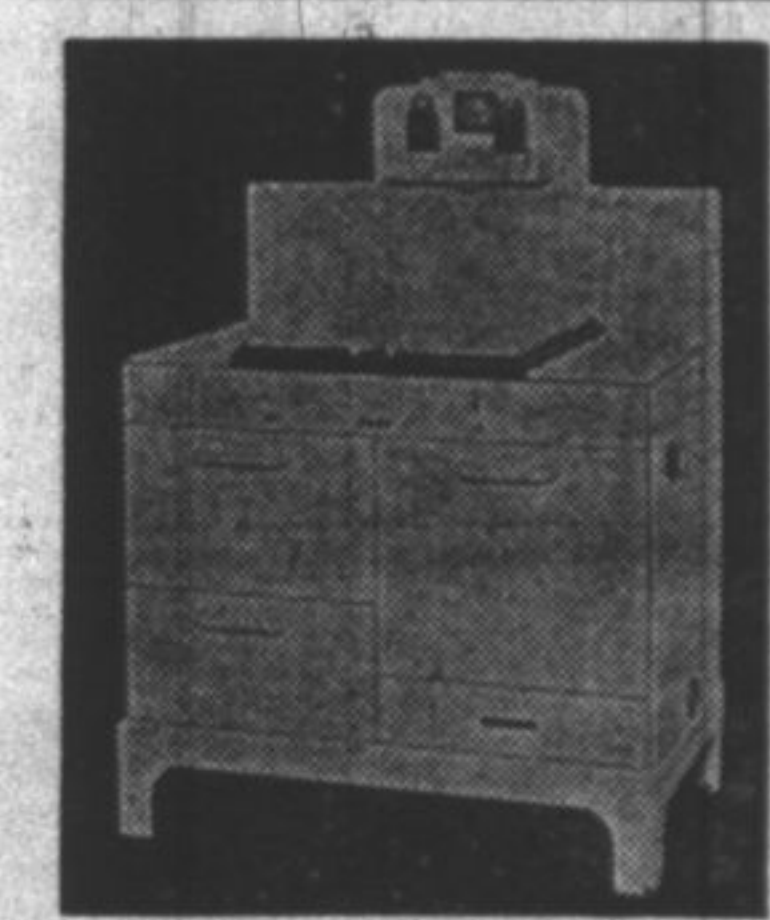
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
