The Republican Women of Deerfield township wish to call attention to the fact that college students of age, or any other eligible voters away from home, and who have not registered, may qualify for voting on Nov. 3, by applying to the County Clerk, Russ Alford, at Waukegan, for an "application blank for a ballot."

After filling out and properly notarizing, it should be mailed back to the County Clerk who will then, previous to the election, mail him a ballot. Ballots to be returned to County Clerk who will deliver it to voters precinct on election day. This application properly filled out must be in the hands of the County Clerk, five days before election.
