Feast Day Novena In Honor of St. Jude

The feast of St. Jude, Oct. 28, and the eight days preceding it will be marked by special solemnity at the Shrine of St. Jude Thaddeus in St. Plus church, South Ashland ave. and 19th st., Chicago, where this "Patron of Difficult Cases" will be especially invoked during a solemn novena beginning Tuesday, Oct. 20. Rev. V. R. Burnell, O.P., director of this internationally famous Shrine announced this week that two Dominican preachers of note, the Very Rev. T. F. Conlon, O.P., national director of Holy Name Society of New York City and Very Rev. J. B. Walsh, O.P., S.T.L., Prior of Dominican Theological School of Somerset, Ohio will alternate in giving the sermons of the novena. There will be High Mass every morning at 10 o'clock and additional services at 3 o'clock in the afternoon and at 6:30 and 8 o'clock in the evening after each of which important relics of St. Jude will be publicly venerated.

Cherry Blossom Is Worshipped in Japan

Perhaps the most interesting side of Japanese character is devotion to flowers. Each month of the year has its favorite flower or tree, their seasons of bloom varying a little according to location in Japan's long stretch from north to south, and during the flowering, all the nation holds festival. The greatest floral festival is that of the cherry blossom when clouds of pink flowers spread over the Empire in early April. All through the month old and young, rich and poor, flock out to some noted spot for cherry-viewing (hana-no), the young people dressed in fantastic costumes to add to the merriment. The Sakura-no-hana, the cherry blossom of Japan, is glorified and worshipped as no other flower in the world. It symbolizes perfection and has been the inspiration and theme of thousands of poems. The single mission of the tree is to be beautiful—they bear no fruit. There are sixteen principal species of blossoming trees, and almost all bear their blooms on leafless branches. Next year's cherry blossom festival begins on April 8, a delightful welcome to passengers on the Empress of Britain, which sails from New York Jan. 9 on a world cruise, and reaches Kobe on the day of the official opening of this national holiday of the Japanese.
