Lake County Will Vote on Glackin Law on November 3

At the national election on Nov. 3, voters of Highland Park and Lake County will be given an opportunity to vote on the new Sanitarium Tax Law or Glackin Law. This will appear on a separate ballot.

In the State of Illinois, thirty-seven counties have already approved this law and have made provision for the care of tubercular patients. At the coming election nine counties, among them Lake County, will be given opportunity to vote on this question.

The law provides for the levy of an additional tax not to exceed a rate of one and one-half (1 1/2) mills on each one dollar of the taxable property of Lake County, Illinois, as assessed and equalized for state and county purposes in excess of the statutory limit of 25 cents per one hundred dollars valuation, for county purpose, for the years 1937 to 1946 inclusive, for the establishing and maintenance of a Lake County Tuberculosis Sanitarium.

The Lake County Tuberculosis has 100 cases of tuberculosis on its files and there are but 22 beds in the county hospital for the care of these patients. It is estimated that a patient can receive sanitarium care for \$2.14 per day.

Citizens will be given the chance to solve this problem of caring for these patients, at the coming election, Nov. 3.

Last Opportunity to Register, October 27

Tuesday, Oct. 27, will be the last opportunity for newcomers to Highland Park, or those who have reached the voting age to register in their precinct. If you have moved you should also be sure that your name is registered in your new precinct, to avoid any inconvenience at the last minute.

The permanent registration law does not apply to Lake county and registration is not compulsory in our county. Certain days, namely Oct. 13 and Oct. 27, are set aside to review the poll books, and to place the names of all voters at the last election on a new register for use in the November election.

Polls will be open from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. Tuesday, Oct. 27. If you are not registered, be sure to do so that day.
