

### \$2500 Short of Goal in Campaign for Community Chest

than we hoped would be necessary." An analysis of our subscriptions to date shows that pledges have not been received as yet from several hundred of our citizens whom we feel want to subscribe to the chest, but for some reason or other have delayed making their subscription promptly. We appeal to them to do their full part in this community undertaking at once.

"We are not sure whether these citizens have been missed by our workers, therefore in order to make certain that those who have not subscribed as yet, have the opportunity to do so, a special letter was sent to them yesterday enclosing their subscription card and urging them to join with the other 1,850 of their fellow citizens who have already done their part toward making this year's campaign a success."

President Cloud Wampler, over whose signature the special letter was sent, said, "The Community Chest campaign is the one city-wide undertaking in which every Highland Park citizen can take part. It is not the responsibility of any one group or class of citizens. Regardless of the size of the subscription he is able to make, every citizen should be proud to share in the community responsibility of making possible the welfare services of the thirteen agencies which make Highland Park a better place in which to live.

"If any citizen who has not yet subscribed has failed to do so because he does not know what the Chest is, or does not understand the work of the welfare agencies supported by the Chest, we urge him

to let us know at once so that we can send someone to explain these things to him fully."

Despite the fact that \$2,500 is still needed to reach the campaign goal this year, the Chest's executive secretary, Edwin C. Jones, pointed out that real progress had been made in this second year's campaign in having reached the amount of last year's goal, \$41,700, two weeks earlier than last year, and that the number of subscribers to the Chest this year had already increased by nearly one hundred over the total subscribers secured last fall.

"These facts indicate a healthy growth of understanding among our citizens of the Chest plan, and a growing community-wide acceptance of responsibility for the support of our local welfare work. We hope to count at least 2,000 subscribers by the time our goal is reached."

### P. O. to Distribute Forms to Employers for Security Act

The Highland Park post office on Monday, Nov. 16, will deliver to all employers in Highland Park the necessary blanks required for use in establishing basic records under the Social Security Act.

It is to the mutual interest of both employers and the Federal government that this form be promptly completed and returned to the local postmaster, not later than November 21, 1936. The form may be handed to your letter carrier or it may be delivered to the local post office, either in person or by messenger, or it may be mailed in a sealed envelope, addressed to the local post office.

The prompt completion and return of the form is particularly important because it will be used in connection with the work of assigning account numbers to your employees, which will follow shortly.

A week later, forms will be sent to all employees, who in turn will fill out their schedule and return same to the local postmaster, to be forwarded to Washington.

A lot may be land so recorded on the Records of the Recorder of Deeds of Lake County, Illinois.' Also, it is proposed to amend Section Three on Intensity of Use of Lots, by insertion therein and adding thereto the words: "include not less than six thousand square feet in area, or shall," so that the same when amended will read as follows (the words inserted by proposed amendment being set out in capitals):

Intensity of Use of Lots: No building with its accessory building shall occupy in excess of thirty per cent (30%) of the area of an interior lot, nor in excess of thirty-five per cent (35%) of the area of a corner lot. No dwelling or group of dwellings shall hereafter be erected or altered to accommodate more than six families on any acre of land, nor make provision for more than a proportional number of families on any fractional part of an acre of land, except that a single family dwelling may be erected on any lot having an area of less than one-sixth of an acre, provided that such lot shall INCLUDE NOT LESS THAN SIX THOUSAND SQUARE FEET IN AREA, OR SHALL have been duly recorded prior to the passage of this ordinance.
