

Campaign Budget Topped by \$256 in 2nd Annual Drive

(Continued from page 1) Announcement of the successful outcome of the campaign was made yesterday by Herman A. Zischke, chairman of the general campaign committee. In making the announcement Mr. Zischke said: "We are happy to be able to report the reaching of our \$45,000 goal today and to have exceeded it by a fair margin. We are confident that this will be increased somewhat with the renewal of a number of substantial subscriptions from a few of our citizens who, owing to absence from the city, have not yet had an opportunity to subscribe. "It has been a splendid achievement for both the community and the nearly three hundred loyal citizen workers who have so effectively carried the message of community welfare work to practically every home in Highland Park. The response of our citizens has been generous and nearly all have shown a keen sense of community responsibility and a desire to cooperate, which greatly lightened the task of the volunteer workers. "To those citizens who volunteered their services in this community undertaking and have given so freely of their time to bring success, I would like to express publicly my personal gratitude for their unselfish and loyal assistance in bringing the campaign to its successful conclusion. "Chest President, Cloud Wampler, interviewed on the successful outcome of the campaign, was enthusiastic in his praise of the work done by the general campaign and special gifts committees. "The splendid work done by Herman Zischke and the fine group of workers enlisted by him for the general campaign and by Herbert Lautmann and the special gifts committee organized by him, deserves the commendation of the entire community," Mr. Wampler said. "The committees ably assisted by the publicity committee directed by Wm. D. McDonald, have rendered a real community service for which every Highland Park citizen, I am sure, is grateful. "It is especially gratifying and encouraging to the future of the Chest," Mr. Wampler said, "to note that the total number of individual pledges turned in by the committees to date represents a net gain of nearly 150 supporting members over the first campaign of a year ago. This is a healthy growth and shows an increasing understanding of the Chest plan of giving and the benefits it brings to the community and the welfare programs of the member agencies of the Chest."
