### North Shore Line Announces Bargain Rates for December

Bargain rates for rail travelers during the month of December are announced by the Chicago North Shore & Milwaukee Railroad—the North Shore Line—when a special schedule of low round-trip holiday fares will be in effect for trips between all points where the round-trip fare is more than \$1.00.

Tickets sold under the reduced rate schedule, which is based on a round-trip fare equal to one and one-half times the charge made for a one-way ride, will be on sale at all North Shore Line stations until January 1. The tickets can be used returning any time within 30 days of the date of sale.

### U. S. Marine Corps Seeks Enlistments

The U. S. Marine Corps is now accepting young men between the ages of 18 and 25 years for enlistment. Men being enlisted now will be sent to Paris Island, South Carolina, for training. The Marine Corps offers a splendid opportunity for travel. Marines are stationed in Cuba, Hawaii, the Philippines, China, Guam, the Virgin Islands, and the Panama Canal Zone. Marines are also stationed on all the larger ships of the navy and travel to all parts of the world. Through the Marine Corps Institute, Marines are enabled to further their education by enrolling for any one of several courses. A diploma is awarded upon completion of each course, and these courses are without cost to the individual.

### Vehicle Licenses for 1937 Should Be Procured Now

Now is the time to apply for your 1937 license plates, according to Secretary of State Edward J. Hughes.

By special arrangement, application blanks are now available at newspaper offices, garages and filling stations throughout Illinois. They also can be secured at motor clubs and county clerk's offices.

According to the Illinois Motor Vehicle Act, car owners must display new plates on January 1. There is no period of grace provided in the law. Car owners failing to comply are subject to arrest.

In applying for tags, said Secretary Hughes, owners will avoid the inconvenience and annoyance experienced in a last minute rush to buy them. Many persons last year were required to stand in line in sub-zero weather in order to purchase plates, he said.

Owners re-registering the same vehicle should return the 1936 registration card with the application for new plates.

It is not necessary to apply for a new certificate of title if the applicant now has one.

The certificate of title is good for the life of the car when in possession of the original owner. If, however, ownership is transferred at any time, a new certificate of title must be obtained by the purchaser.

Those registering new cars for the first time are required to apply for a certificate of title, which will be issued upon presentation of a bill of sale.

An applicant for plates for a newly acquired used car must furnish evidence of ownership in the form of a properly endorsed certificate of title from the previous owner.

Through the co-operation of car owners, installation of modern machinery and establishment of a branch office of the automobile department in Chicago, Secretary Hughes registered by April 1st this year, 1,161,246 cars, almost twice as many as were registered for the same period of 1935. Each year since 1933 has shown a marked increase in early registrations. In the first three months of 1934 a total of 939,899 cars were licensed and for the same period of 1935 vehicles numbering 1,025,273 were registered.

"There is no reason why all mo-

tor vehicles should not be licensed by January 1 as required by the law," said Secretary Hughes, "the year 1937 should set a new record of early registrations.

"To obey the law is a mark of good citizenship. It is unfair for some car owners to drive on our streets and highways with obsolete tags while others are doing their part

to cooperate with the state officers."

The 1937 plates are canary yellow and black. Numerals on the plates will be black and the background will be canary yellow. The year and name of the state will be stamped "19-ILLINOIS-37" above the license numbers instead of below as on this year's plates.
