

### Ravinia Women Win Awards Monday at County Hobby Show

One of the most interesting and unique exhibits at the Hobby Show sponsored by the Lake County Federation of Women's Clubs, held on Monday at the Masonic Temple in Waukegan, was that of the Ravinia Woman's Club. Three first, two second and two third ribbon prizes were awarded this exhibit, which included interesting oil paintings of Galena by William Savin, unusual pastel portraits by his wife, Lucille E. Savin, a lovely Spanish shawl belonging to the president of the club, Mrs. Godfrey Eyer, and attractive hand made pewter dishes made by Mrs. Henry Dubin and Mrs. Leonard Rieser. Representing the club were Mrs. Eyer and Mrs. Mary Helmholtz, who will have charge of the Hobby Show to be held by the local club in early April. The Waukegan show was a direct outgrowth of the successful Hobby Show held last spring in Ravinia, under the direction of Mrs. John Van Bergen and her Art Committee.

Another project of the local club's Art Committee, suggested by Mrs. Rieser, is the month long art exhibit of one artist in the music room at the Ravinia school, where the children can see and study the works of local artists of reputation, and thus develop a taste for art as a part of their daily lives. This month the exhibit is a number of colorful landscapes by Tom Wilder.

### Conservations Dept. Asks Hunters to Return Bird Bands

The Department of Conservation released prior to the hunting season approximately 3,000 cock pheasants and 3,500 quail all equipped with metal leg bands bearing identification numbers. The department seeks the cooperation of the shooter in the field in returning bands from birds killed to the department, accompanied by data as exact as possible as to location, date, kind of cover and size of covey. The department keeps an accurate record of all birds released, and makes every effort to release birds in locations suitable from the standpoint of food, cover and protection. Bands and data returned to the department serve as valuable reference material in determining the best procedure and locations for liberating birds raised on the state game farm, the total of which was, this year, 15,500 pheasant and 6,000 quail.

### New Ham Brings Homemaker Economy

Butt and Shank Ends More Tender Than Center Cuts of Hot Ham.

Add a second layer of apples and finally top with third slice of ham. Sprinkle with brown sugar. Heat in a modern oven (350°) approximately 45 minutes.

"As I Remember," by Arnold Genthe. This is the book of a famous raconteur and photographer. lay behind the mysterious fringe of the West African coast. And because everyone told them it couldn't be done, they set out to cross Africa on motorcycles. Five months it took them from the Atlantic ocean to the Red Sea.

"Southern Gates of Arabia," by Freya Stark. Miss Stark, author of "Valleys of the Assassins," has written another book even more enthralling and extraordinary than her first. Though in early time Hadramaut was the center of the lucrative and romantic incense trade, few Europeans have penetrated that state of tribal warfare which for centuries has isolated this former thoroughfare and given it its evil reputation among travelers up to recent times.

"I Found No Peace," by Webb Miller. The journal of a foreign correspondent who in 1916 quit his job as reporter on a Chicago paper to cover the pursuit of Villa in Mexico. From there he went to the Western Front and after the war covered the fighting in Spanish Morocco, the Gandhi revolution in India and the Italian invasion of Ethiopia. He is now in Spain and

as his book comes off the press he writes from Spain, "I find no peace."
