

Auto Licenses Must Be Secured Before January 1

Distribution of the 1937 Illinois license plates began this week, Secretary of State Edward J. Hughes announced.

More than 100,000 plates were placed in the mails this morning consisting for the most part of re-assigned numbers. According to the Motor Vehicle Act it is mandatory that the secretary of state make such re-assignments if requests are made before December 1st.

Plates also were placed on sale "over the counter" both here at the state house and at the automobile department's branch office in Chicago at 210 S. Ashland Blvd.

With only the remainder of the month left in which to purchase plates, police authorities have indicated to Secretary Hughes a disposition to arrest immediately after Jan. 1st any car owner who fails to obtain new plates.

Under the law car owners must display new tags on Jan. 1st. There is no period of grace provided in the act. Car owners failing to comply are subject to arrest.

Machinery for the big job of registering and issuing plates to Illinois' million and a half motorists has been geared to top speed, Mr. Hughes declared. From now on for many weeks to come, the secretary's automobile office staff will work in three 8-hour shifts to insure speedy delivery of plates to car owners.

Application blanks are available at newspaper offices, garages and filling stations throughout Illinois. They also can be obtained at motor clubs and county clerk's offices.

For the guidance of automobile owners in applying for plates the following regulations have been issued by Secretary Hughes:

Applications for licenses must be submitted on the special forms provided by the secretary of state.

With applications send a certified check, draft, postal or express money order. Do not send currency or stamps, as the automobile department is not authorized to accept stamps and will assume no responsibility for the loss of currency.

Owners reregistering the same vehicle should return the 1936 registration card with the application for new plates. It is not necessary to apply for a new certificate of title if the applicant now has one. The title is valid for the life of the car when in possession of the original owner. If, however, ownership is transferred at any time, a new certificate of title must be obtained by the purchaser.

Application for a certificate of title is required for those registering new cars for the first time, which will be issued upon presentation of a bill of sale.

A resident of Illinois who purchases a vehicle in another state must pay a \$15.00 investigation charge if the foreign state title is not issued to him.

The same schedule of fees which were reduced last year through Mr. Hughes efforts will apply this year as follows:

25 H.P. and less \$8.00 plates reduced to \$6.50.
 35 H.P. and more than 25 \$12.00 plates reduced to \$10.50.
 50 H.P. and more than 35 \$20.00 plates reduced to \$17.00.
 More than 50 H.P. \$25.00 plates reduced to \$22.00.

The 1937 plates are canary yellow and black.

Secretary Hughes urges all motorists to make early application for tags, preferably through the mail to the Springfield office. By so doing car owners will avoid waiting in line to secure them "cash and carry" before the deadline January 1st.
