Today's Driving Hint



Comes winter and snow—Long range forecasting not being as far advanced as the weather forecasters would like it to be, we cannot tell how much snow we are going to have, or when we are going to have it. However, we do know that we are going to have it; so it behooves us to be prepared for the road conditions snow creates. What preparations can we make?

Well, if you live in, or do much traveling in a rural area, buy a set of chains for when the snow is deep. Also, it is not a bad idea to have a small shovel for use in digging the car out of drifts or ditches if you happen to skid.

If you live in an urban section where authorities make an attempt, at least, to clear the streets, you won't need a full set of chains; (which "burn up" very easily on pavement). One or two of the "snap-on" chain sets which hit the market a few years ago should suffice. Remember this, however: chains of any variety will NOT effect miracles. You CANNOT drive over snow-covered streets or roads with the ease or safety that you experience on a clean surface, regardless of the chains. The latter will give you traction in starting and some in stopping, but YOU MUST USE CAUTION!
