Consumer Cooperation in America, by Bertram B. Fowler. The answer of 2,000,000 Americans to high prices and shoddy quality has been a series of consumer owned and operated retail, wholesale and manufacturing enterprises. The consumer cooperative movement is growing fast in this country. This book tells its accomplishments and its aims.

Unexpected Years, by Laurence Housman. The autobiography of an English poet, illustrator and playwright, the author of *Prinella*, the *Little Plays of St. Francis*, *Victoria Regina* and others. Mr. Housman is the brother of A. E. Housman, the poet.

Artist and Naturalist in Ethiopia, by L. A. Fuertes and W. H. Osgood. This is the story of a scientific expedition to Ethiopia undertaken before the eyes of the world were focussed on that remote country. The diary form serves not only to record the specimens the two friends, Louis Agassiz Fuertes and Wilfred H. Osgood, identified but also gives a picture of the country and the civilization there. The originals of Fuertes' paintings are on view at the Field Museum of Chicago.

The Hoover Administration, by W. S. Myers and W. H. Newton. The complete, fully documented, and authoritative story of Herbert Hoover's four years in Washington: the history of political and economic events in the United States from 1929 to 1933 as seen from the White House. In preparing the book the authors, with the full cooperation of Mr. Hoover, have had access to diaries, memoranda, state papers and other original material not previously available to any writer. As economic and political history it is of immediate importance to every American, and as a chronicle of a critical time in our national existence it is absorbing reading.

Edna St. Vincent Millay and Her Times, by Elizabeth Atkins. An ardent and brilliant critical study of the only living poet who is quoted in the rural schools of Oregon, the night clubs of New York, and the Sorbonne of Paris. Every reader of Edna St. Vincent Millay's poetry will read it with more sensitive appreciation and understanding after reading this book about it and about the mind, spirit, and personality that creates it.

March of Science, by H. Gordon Garbedian. Mr. Garbedian provides an absorbing and instructive tour of the laboratories of the world written so that a layman, even without a scientific background, can readily understand what is going on in science today. In this book instead of pointing to the unloved

problems of science, he details the amazing strides that science has actually made in recent years on many fronts. Chemistry, physics, biology, astronomy, geology, bacteriology, medicine, even sociology, come within the scope of this comprehensive book, and in each instance the author gives the reader a detailed account of what progress is being made.

The Deerfield school paper tells the following about the trip: "The applicants for citizenship had already taken their tests and appeared before the court with their witnesses for their final papers. To give the children some idea of the questions asked, the judge instructed the questioner to question some of the applicants. One man failed to bring two witnesses so he has to appear in the March term of court. After we had listened to several applicants, we left the court room for a tour of the court house. We were especially interested in the talk of Mr. Decker, Judge of the Probate Court. Mr. Mason, states attorney, told us of their new system of communication within the building. We also went through the jail.

We are grateful to Mr. James O'Connor, supervisor, for showing us through the Court House and to the auxiliary for making it possible for us to go.

The special mention of Judge Decker is of interest to older residents of the village. Judge Decker stopped court proceedings to welcome the Deerfield children and to tell of his strong attachment for the place, because he is a former teacher in the Deerfield Grammar school.
