Ten outstanding magazine articles for December:

"Issues Before the Next Administration" by Walter Lippman in the *Yale Review*. Mr. Lippman defines clearly and forcibly the paramount issues immediately facing our national government: the management of recovery and the planning of a policy of neutrality strong enough to prevent entanglement in a threatened European war.

"The Strategic Future of the Mediterranean" by B. H. Liddell Hart in the *Yale Review*. An analysis by an eminent military expert of the changes in the relative strategic positions of the European powers caused by recent events in the Mediterranean and the development of new armament.

"The Deadly Issue" by Bronislaw Malinowski in *The Atlantic Monthly*. A reasoned and thoroughly provocative analysis of why men fight — by the world's greatest authority on primitive man.

"The Nature of Telepathy" by Ernest Hunter Wright in *Harper's Magazine*. This strange force is now a proven fact. What is it? What does it signify? Can it be harnessed? The head of the English department at Columbia discusses the amazing results of experiments at Duke university.

"Minding His Own Neighborhood Business" by John Palmer Gavit in *Survey Graphic*. The foreign affairs editor of *Survey Graphic*, who has known Cordell Hull since his congressional days when he wrote the income tax bill, gives us an informal portrait of a good neighbor who doesn't always mind his own business.

"Arab and Jew in the Holy Land" by William Schack in *Forum and Century*. In Palestine two racial groups are girding for a bitter struggle. Now, when Zionism has become almost a reality, the Arabs have risen in ruthless, violent opposition. This article presents the unadorned facts, cutting through the emotional screens that are apt to becloud the situation.

"The Decline of the Male" by Thomas H. Uzzell and V. E. Leroy in *Scribner's Magazine*. Mr. Uzzell and Mr. LeRoy study American novels, films, plays, advertisements, and man himself and conclude that today's world turns on a woman's word.

"Why Things Grow Old" by Roy Helton in *Harper's Magazine*. A remarkable article in which Mr. Helton advances a new conception of the growing old process and applies it not only to civilization and cultures and governments, but to love-in-marriage and to the prolongation of active human life.

"Machines and Individuals" by Peter van Dresser in *Harper's Magazine*. Today's science and technics are putting into our hands the tools to create a new and lofty civilization, far more efficient, enlightened and happy than any before dreamed of. Have we the sense to use them? Mr. van Dresser gives us a thrilling picture of co-ordinated civilization.

"The Middle West Takes Up the Torch" by A. Washington Pezet in *Forum and Century*. It is not sheer chance that the middle west is producing a new and vital American art. Unhindered by the vacation-mindedness and ancestor worship of other sections, the citizens give themselves to the appreciation and support of their own living artists.

### Today's Driving Hint



(Prepared by the Safety & Traffic Engineering Department of the Chicago Motor Club).

The early dusk of winter days and the sudden darkness which is a part of winter's uncertain weather increase the importance of a generally neglected part of the car's equipment — the lighting system.

No other item of automobile equipment is more important. The lights — both the head-lamps and tail-lamps — should be given the same attention as the motor or any other part of the car. Here are some of the things we can do to insure their proper operation:

1. Wipe the outside of the lenses every day to remove the road grime. No matter how strong the lamps may be, they cannot shine through the blank wall which dirt will create.

2. Wipe the inside of the lenses at least once a month. Dirt will get inside the lamp regardless of how tightly it is fastened. Clean the reflectors at the same time, using the special polish with which any service station can supply you. Be sure to use a very soft paper or cloth to avoid scratching the highly polished surface.

3. Most tail lights do double duty, the light serving as "stop" filament generally outlasts the other one, because the latter is used more often. However, it is well to check up every now and then to see if the "stop" signal is working.

"Under Two Flags." Cast: Claudette Colbert, Ronald Colman, Victor McLaglen. Thursday, Dec. 31. Desert sands with their mysterious beauty—teeming native bazaars and barren isolated forts provide an intriguing background to this screen version of Onida's famous novel of the Foreign Legion. There are more than twenty distinctly etched characters in this powerful cast—but none more effective than that of Cigarettes and interpreted by Claudette Colbert. Rapidly changeable of mood, she seems symbolic of the desert she knows so well. The story is reminiscent of Beau Geste and carries all the stock drama glamor, bravery, sacrifice and tense excitement of that famous story. Family.

"15 Maiden Lane." Cast: Claire Trevor, Cesar Romero, Douglas Fowley, Floyd Nolan. Wednesday, Thursday, Jan. 6 and 7.
