A young north shore pianist, Bernice Jacobson, who lives at 2014 Maple ave., Evanston, has been selected as one of five winners in the recent federal music project contest to choose soloists for appearances with the Illinois Symphony Orchestra.

Edward Katz, a New Trier high school student, will appear as soloist with the Illinois Symphony Orchestra, under direction of Izler Solomon, at New Trier high school, on Monday, January 11, at 2:15 p.m.

The youthful pianists offering will be the First Movement of Mendelssohn's Concerto. The Illinois Symphony will present another program on the same evening at 8:15 p.m., at New Trier high school, featuring Sibelius' Symphony No. 5, E-flat major, Op. 82. Elizabeth Moritz, pianist, who studied in Europe and made numerous successful concert appearances on the continent, will be soloist, playing the first performance of Radio Britain's Rhapsodic Fantasia for piano and orchestra.

Organizations Join to Hear Travel Talk on Guatemala, Jan. 8

Orval Simpson of Winnetka will show motion pictures of Guatemala at the joint meeting of the Deerfield Parent-Teacher association and the Deerfield Woman's club, on Friday, January 8 at the Deerfield Grammar school auditorium at 8 o'clock.

Mr. Simpson will take his audience on a travel tour, showing the colorful beauty of the small republic of Guatemala in Central America. There will be pictures of Banahna land, the jungle, the primitive winnowing of wheat by the Indians, unusual religious ceremonies, and the great market of San Francisco de Alto.

The monuments of a past civilization and a contemporaneous, native life, more picturesque, it is said, than anything else in the world today, have given the name of "The Little Egypt of America" to this country. Its remarkable, agreeable climate has caused others to call it

the "land of eternal spring." Because of its mountain scenery and lakes, Guatemala has also been named "the tropical Switzerland." Considering all three titles, Mr. Simpson says the absorbing fascination of the country can be fully appreciated only by seeing pictures of Guatemala.

The republic is a small country the size of Ohio, but contains more diversified plant life, more monuments of ancient civilization and more magnificent scenery than any other equal area in the world. It has, also, modern improvements, an excellent system of roads, a notable system of public schools, paving and public buildings, which amaze the visitor of Guatemala. Here, too, is the finest colonial church in America, with a statue of Christ crucified and dates back to 1594.

The public is cordially invited to hear Mr. Simpson. The members of both organizations are urged to attend this meeting and are also asked to tell their friends of this extremely fine program.

Grade Separation in Libertyville Is '37 Highway Program

An important highway project that will be initiated in Libertyville during the coming year is the Milwaukee avenue grade separation at the Chicago, Milwaukee and St. Paul tracks in the village.

Milwaukee avenue is a four-lane traffic artery from Cook county north to Half Day at the present time, but the same highway program calls for the widening of the road as far as Libertyville. It proposes to widen the street to a lesser degree through the village business district, and eventually elevate its grade over the railroad tracks.

The Hayden-Cartwright bill makes it mandatory that 25 per cent of the allotment of federal funds to the state be used for the separation of grade crossings. Part of the fund in this case will be allotted to the railroad, thus dividing the cost three ways among the rail-

road, the state and the federal government. This will bring the cost within range of possibility. Estimated cost of the Libertyville improvement is \$60,000, excluding property damage to be involved.

The grade crossing in Libertyville is considered a menace and highway builders admit that it would be folly to widen Milwaukee avenue and not eliminate the death trap in the heart of the village. C. H. Apple, district highway engineer, is understood to have the Milwaukee avenue project under consideration in connection with the proposed widening.
