Jamboree Only 6 Months Away
The National Boy Scout Jamboree is less than six months away and many North Shore Scouts are eagerly awaiting the day when they shall camp together for ten days with Scouts from all over the country at the campsite in the Nations Capital.

Many thousands of boys will gather for the entire day camp on the shores of the Potomac for the first national jamboree. Many will recall that the jamboree was originally scheduled for August, 1935, but because of an epidemic was called off by the President of the United States on the advice of the Surgeon General and after consultation with Scout Officials.

The jamboree will be held this year, the last part of June and the first part of July. Camp Ma-Ka-Ja-Wan will open its 8th season during the same period and scouts attending the jamboree will be back from Washington in time to participate in the second period activities at the North Shore Scout camp on Spring Lake in Wisconsin.

Executive Board to Meet
The executive board of the North Shore Area council, will meet in the Area Scout headquarters next Thursday evening, Jan. 14 at 7:45 p.m.

This meeting is of great importance to North Shore Scouting as several very important items are up for consideration. Mr. Henry Fowler, president of the council urges every member to be present.

Council's Net Gain for 1936
The North Shore Area Council, Boy Scouts of America, as the 1936 ended showed a substantial net gain in membership in all of its phases. In Cubbing the council showed a net gain of 143 boys, ending the year with 626 Cubs as against 477 Dec. 31, 1935. There were 92 more Scouts in 1936 than there were in 1935, there being 1966 and 1874 each year, respectively.

Last year showed a gain over the previous year in Scouters (men) engaged in Scout leadership. As the old year came to an end, 535 were registered as leaders in Scouting and Cubbing on the North Shore. This was fifteen more than the year 1935.

As we summarize these figures we find that there was a grand total of 3127 men and boys or 256 more than the 2871 of a year ago. The increase in boy membership was 10.3 per cent.

The council officials wish to thank all of the loyal local Scouters who made this record possible for it is not without the help of the many men in the several districts that progress in Scouting is made.

The year 1937, the 10th anniversary year will be a year of greater activity, greater accomplishment and greater membership.

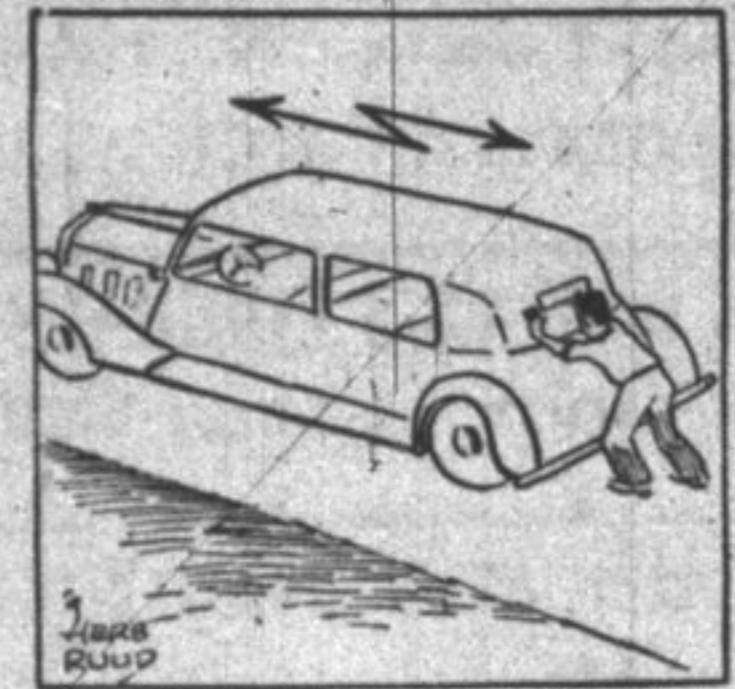
Highland Park Meet January 11th

Today's Driving Hint



Have you ever been stalled somewhere, far from a service station, with a starter which refused to work? To those who haven't had the experience here's a little advice from the Chicago Motor club on how to get out of the situation.

Nine times out of ten the reason for the starter's failure to function is because the pinion gear on the starting motor fails to free itself from the gear on the flywheel. With this gear out of normal position the starting motor does not receive the current and, consequently, will not turn over.

The first move to make is to put the car in high gear, first making certain that the ignition is turned off. Then get out of the car and rock it back and forth by pushing from the rear or pulling from the front. Generally this action, which causes the flywheel to turn slightly, will free the starter gear.

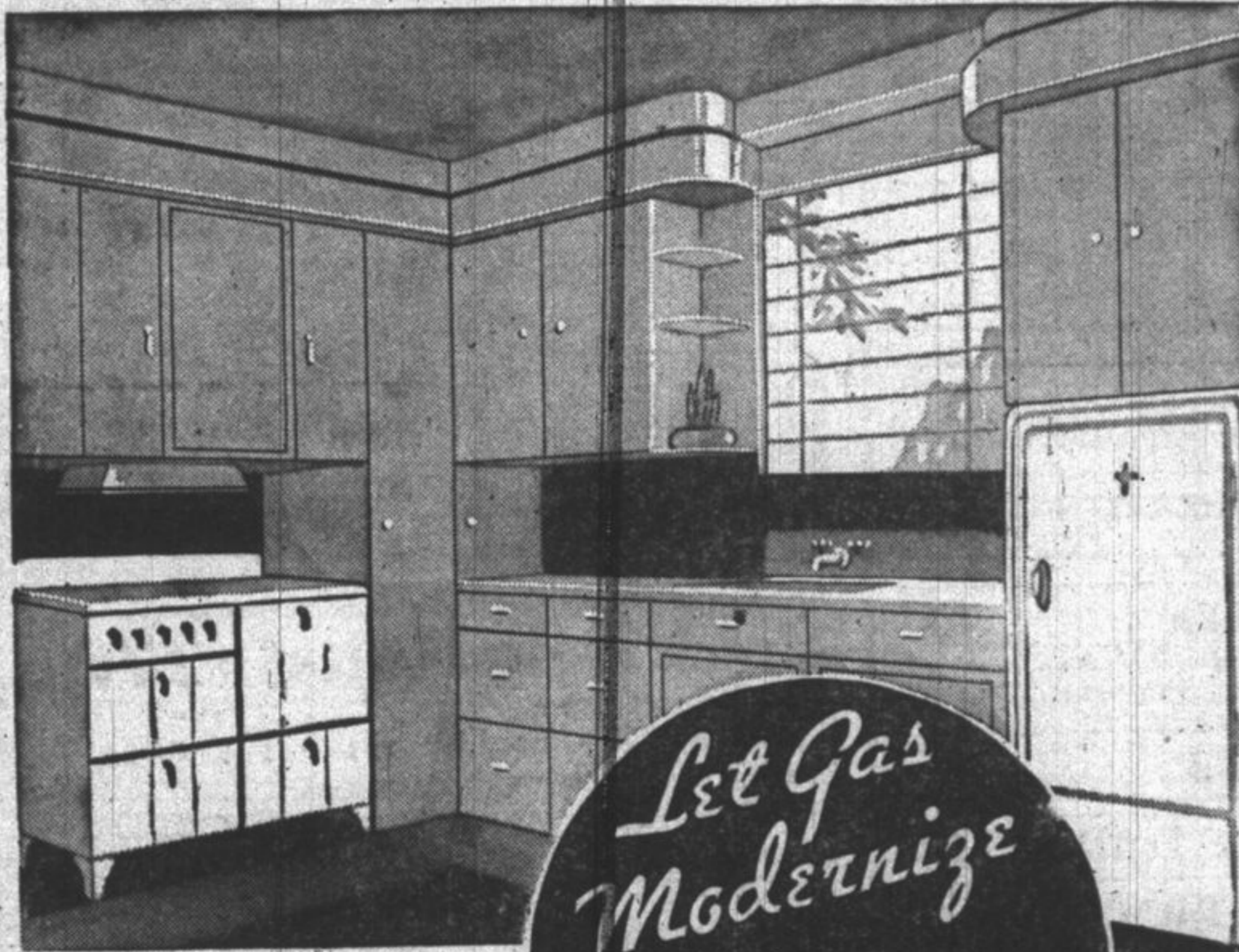

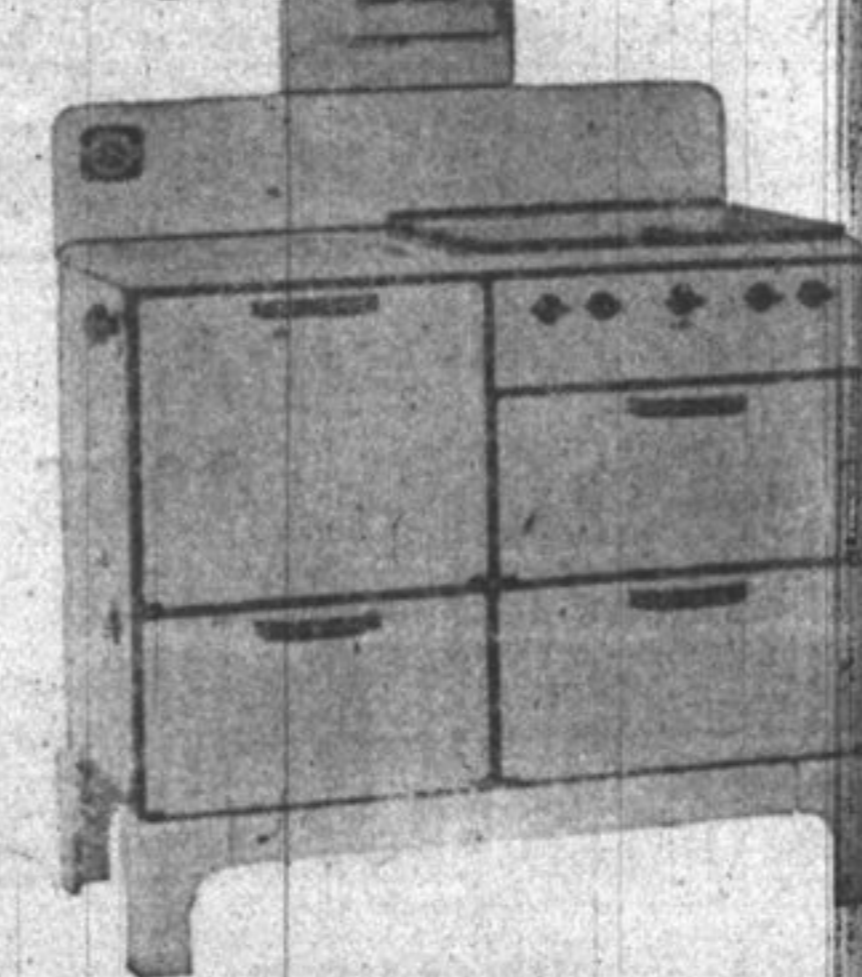
