

Leaders Commend United Air Lines for Fine Record

United Air Lines is receiving congratulations this week from leaders in the aviation industry for its outstanding 1936 record which established it again this year as the world's leading airline in point of traffic ton miles. With a record of 17,000,000 airplane miles flown over its coast-to-coast airway during the 12 months ended December 31, 1936 United completed the year with a record of 106,000,000 revenue passenger-miles, more than have been flown by any other airline in the world. A total of 223,000 revenue passengers were carried alone, with record-breaking volume of mail and express.

According to W. A. Patterson, president of the airline, the year was noteworthy not only for the unprecedented volume of passenger and cargo traffic, but also for the company's developments in improvements and acquisition of new equipment. More active than in any other year, United's staff of technical experts devoted intensive work to the several important projects calculated to increase even more the dependability of air travel. Outstanding among these were the instrument radio landing system which United is bringing to perfection, the anti-static antenna system with which experiments are still being completed, and high altitude tests on the medical affects of rarefied atmosphere on passengers in conjunction with the company's research on sub-stratosphere flying.

Toward the end of the year the company placed in service the first of its new \$3,000,000 fleet of 28 Douglas "Mainliners" of which ten are standard 21-passenger club planes, 10 are de luxe skylounge Mainliners carrying 14 passengers in a cabin large enough for 21, and eight are 14-passenger sleeper planes.

Augmenting its fleet of "Mainliners" are thirty of the Boeing twin-engined 3-mile-a-minute trans-

ports for the frequent inter-city schedules and intermediate service. Mr. Patterson is a North Shore resident, living at 162 Abingdon ave., Kenilworth.

Submit Amendments to Motor Vehicle Law to Legislature

Amendments to the Illinois Motor Vehicle Law, extending the time for annual registration of motor vehicles from January 1 to April 1, have been drafted by the Illinois Automobile club and will be introduced in the Legislature which convenes early in January, according to a statement issued by that club. No change in the present registration procedure is made by these amendments, but motorists would gain relief from the present law requiring registration during the holiday season and the cold winter months when living costs are at the peak and driving conditions at the worst. On the other hand, the

State would suffer no diminution in revenue but, on the contrary, would probably receive increased gasoline tax revenue through greater use of motor vehicles, this being the experience of other states which have already enacted such a law. Under the proposed amendments, motorists must register before April 1, after which date a penalty would be imposed.

"The most important point in considering the present registration law, is to provide relief for motorists, not to inflict additional hardships on them," said Carl A. Barrett, president of the Illinois Automobile club, in explaining the club's proposed amendments. "For years the law has required registration before January 1, but it has been found impossible to enforce this law. The State Automobile department cannot issue the more than 1,300,000 plates in the two weeks' time before Christmas given under the law the post office will not handle them during the holiday rush,

and a majority of the motor vehicle owning public has demonstrated that it will not buy the plates during the holiday season. Many other states have solved this problem satisfactorily to the state and to the motorists, and it is time Illinois does the same.

"Under the amendments to be proposed and sponsored by the Illinois Automobile club, the registration year will expire annually as now, on December 31. Applications for numbers already carried by motorists will continue, as now, to be made not less than thirty days prior to the expiration date. But the registration of a vehicle, operated on the public highways after December 31 which has not been registered, will be deemed delinquent. Then, if the vehicle is not registered and the fee paid within ninety days after the fee becomes delinquent—April 1—a penalty will be added to the regular registration fee. Registration and payment of the required fee, at any time before April 1, will carry no penalty.

"Included in these proposed amendments, the Illinois Automobile club will submit another provision—that no registration fee shall be required for the month of December on any motor vehicle sold, in good faith, by a dealer and delivered by him to the purchaser during that month. However, this exemption will be good for the month of December only, and registration for the new year will be required on or before January 1, no extension of time being allowed on such vehicles. This is the present practice of the State Automobile department; this proposed amendment would merely validate this practice."
