Preliminary Lessons in Learning To Fly

(This is the first article of a series of brief informative lessons designed to form a complete ground school course in flying.)

In spite of the hundreds of books that have been written on the subject, there is only one way to learn to fly. That one way is actually to take a plane up and fly

it. The books are only supplementary. But this is not in any way meant to convey that a complete ground study of weather conditions, the ship and its motor is just so much wasted time. No pilot living has ever learned all there is to know about this business or sport of flying, either on the ground or in the air.

The most advantageous way to spend that first lesson in flying is to stand at a good vantage point on the flying field with your instructor, if possible, but otherwise alone, concentrating on the way other pupils perform. Watch everything, no matter how small or seemingly unimportant it might seem, that happens when a plane lands or takes off. Notice how the more advanced of the beginners approach the field, whether "up wind," as he should, or slightly "down wind," which latter approach would be avoided if possible.

Then have your instructor take you aloft so as to allow you a period of "orientation" so that you

may "get the feel" of the ship, the general flying conditions and the various landmarks, such as the hangar, chimneys and railroad tracks about your particular field.

Problems of zoning will also be discussed. Until recently Mr. Kingery served as the non-political head of the Division of Public Highways and Building of the State of Illinois under Governor Horner.
