

Detailed reports of the activities of these lads has not yet reached the regional office, but it is known that some of them are already active in the flood stricken areas. Fred Morrell of the ECW office, Washington, telephones Mr. Wilson regarding the use of the Federal CCC camps for relief work, and was told that camps in the flood zone had already been authorized to give all possible aid in this regard.

It was suggested to Mr. Kunkel, assistant commissioner in the Department of Conservation at Indianapolis, by Mr. Wilson, that he contact Supervisor H. P. Brandner of the Hoosier national forest for any assistance desired. This statement was made in answer to a request for rescue workers by a long distance telephone call from Mr. Kunkel. R.

B. McKennan, supervisor of the Wayne national forest in Ohio wired to the office here for authorization to use his CCC camps for relief work, and permission was im-

mediately granted. G. S. Horton, supervisor of the Shawnee national forest in Illinois, recently notified the regional office that one of his CCC camps was already being used for relief work in the flood zone. He also reported that his forest nursery was in danger of being flooded.

Approximately 2200 CCC boys are available in national forest camps in Illinois, Ohio, and Indiana, all of whom can be used in the present emergency.


