Because thy loving kindness is better than life, my lips shall praise thee" (Psalms 63:1-3).

The Lesson-Sermon also included the following passages from the Christian Science Textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures," by Mary Baker Eddy: "People go into ecstasies over the sense of a corporeal Jehovah, though with scarcely a spark of love in their hearts; yet God is Love, and without Love, God, immortality cannot appear. Mortals believe in a finite personal God; while God is infinite Love, which must be unlimited" (p. 312).

A prime example of discourtesy, the Chicago Motor club points out, is the action of the driver who slam-bangs thru puddles of water,

splashing the pedestrians who are unfortunate enough to be within range. How many dresses and suits have had to be sent to the cleaners as a result nobody knows. There's no necessity for the driver's action. If space permits, he can swing around the puddles; if it doesn't, he can slacken speed, so that his wheels won't hit the puddles with great force, thereby cutting down the field of the spray.

Remember the next time you are driving in wet weather that it's only your possession of a car that keeps you from being the one who gets splashed, and govern yourself accordingly.

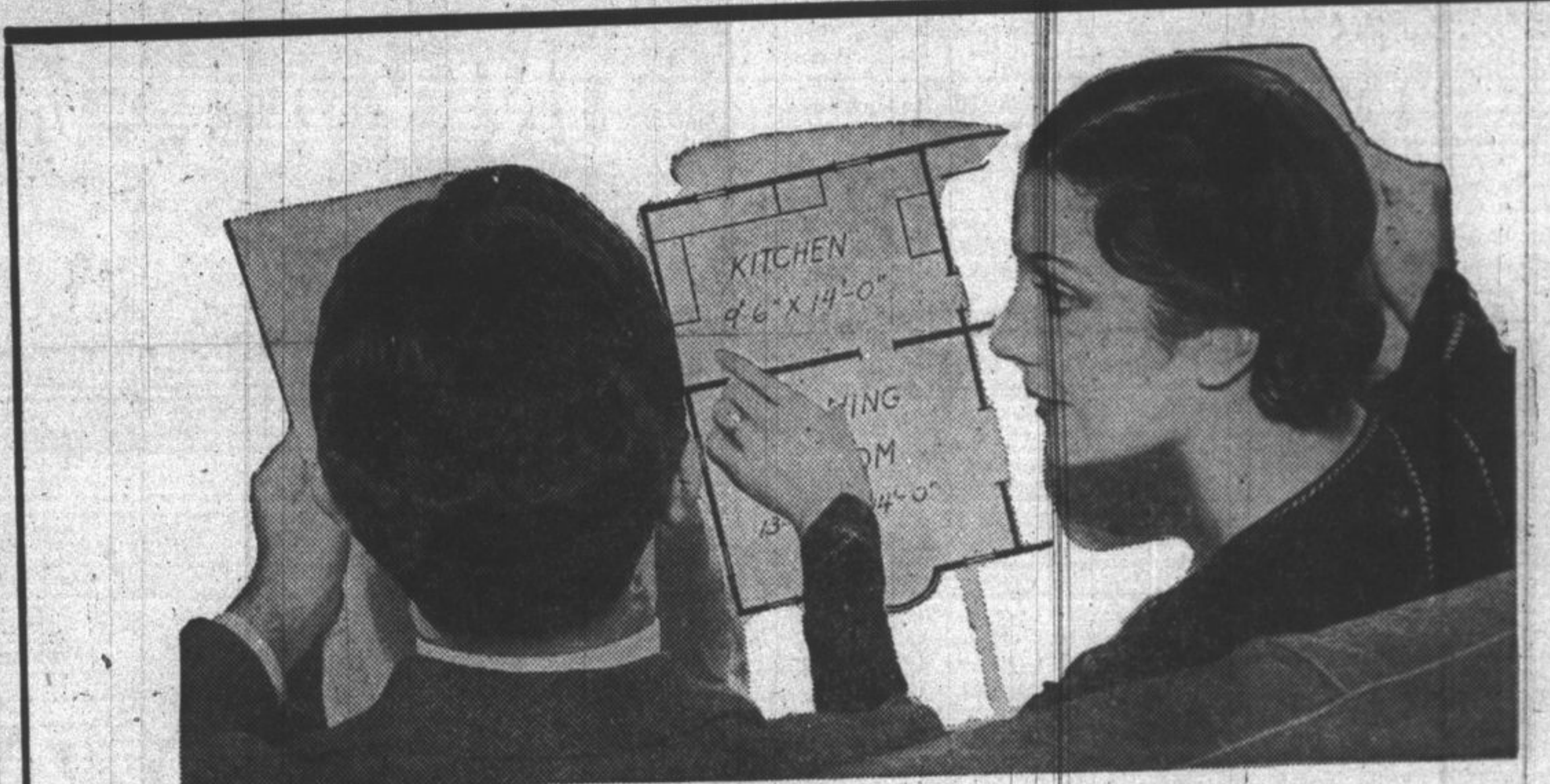

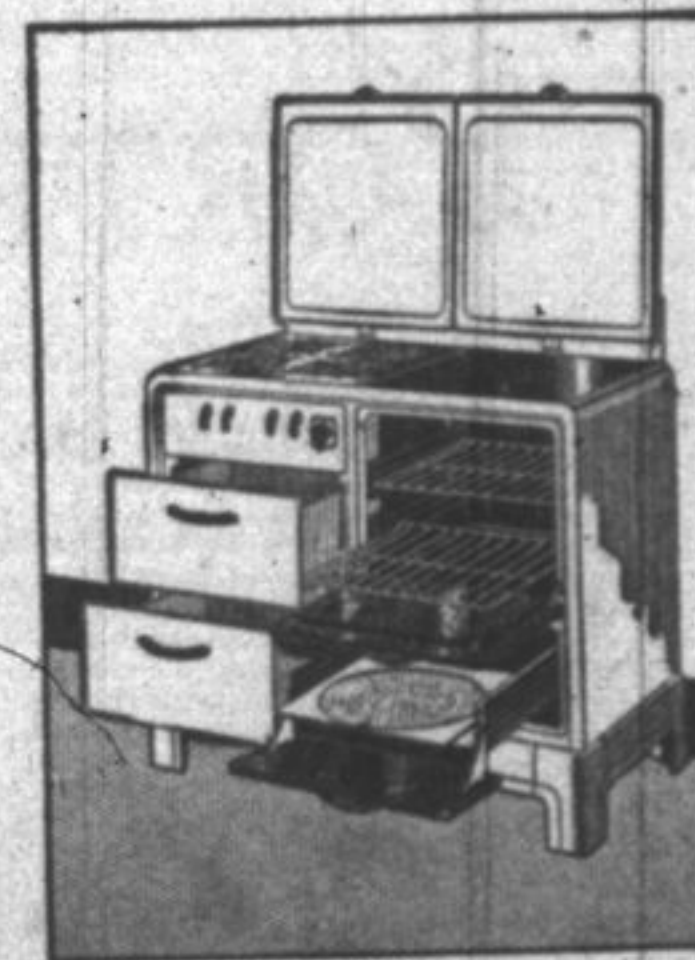
