It is seldom that husband and wife are both artists of reputation, such as Mr. and Mrs. Peyraud, and they each have a fine respect for the other's ability. Mr. Peyraud is of Swiss birth, and is a graduate of the Beaux Arts in Paris, where he studied to be an architect. This influence is evident in his paintings, which with their beauty of tone color are also beautiful in design. Mr. Peyraud has won prizes and medals throughout the United States and in Europe for his colorful landscapes, which carry a feeling of the season portrayed to the mind of the spectator. Mrs. Peyraud specializes in portraits and still life work, is a graduate of the Chicago Art institute, and has also won many awards

on her splendid work. One of the portraits at the school is that of Mary Gehr, one of the early students in the Ravinia school, who has been successful in a dancing career. ## Morton Here in Conference Game

Morton high school of Cicero comes to the Highland Park gym Friday night for a regular Suburban league game. In games this week the local varsity dropped two hard-fought contests. Last Friday, the Proviso varsity from Maywood took their twentieth straight victory by a score of 34-14. Their win was the ninth this season with no losses and their record shows 37 victories in the last 40 games. The game was barely under way when Benson, local center, dropped in a basket to put the Highland Park team in the lead. The score at the end of the quarter remained 8-6 for Proviso when Danny Davis dribbled the full length of the floor only to miss a

well earned basket that would have tied the score. In the last half, Proviso consistently widened its margin of victory. Coach Thurston's boys gave Oak Park a scare in the other league contest Tuesday afternoon. The final count was 23-19 when the Highland Park boys were unable to connect on free throws that might have put them in the victory column. Chuck Lauer's sophomores nosed out Proviso 15-12 in a game that changed hands regularly throughout. Tommie Summer's free throws spelled victory. At Oak Park, however, they were unable to stand the pace set by the league pace setters who have won nine straight games. Zanotti, local veteran guard, did not play because of illness. Varsity wins over non-league schools indicate that the losses of the locals are not so much due to weakness of the Highland Park team as to the unusual strength of their opponents in conference competition. However, the law of averages should begin to operate and local fans will be looking for a win over Morton Friday night.
