Warn Motorists to Secure 1937 Licenses

With more than a million passenger cars already registered, police authorities have indicated to Secretary of State Edward J. Hughes that they will begin immediately to arrest motorists operating cars bearing obsolete license plates.

Although the Motor Vehicle Law requires all cars to be registered by January 1st, some motorists persist in operating their cars with last year's plates.

Secretary Hughes said that many of the recalcitrant are motorists who do not use their cars during winter months.

During the entire year of 1936, a total of 1,459,195 passenger cars were licensed by Secretary Hughes. Officials of the automobile department said that registrations thus far this year compare favorably with the registrations of last year.

In a letter issued to all enforcement officers, Secretary Hughes pointed out:

"There are still many car owners operating vehicles with 1936 licenses. This office began mailing 1937 plates on Dec. 7, 1936, and I feel that operators have had ample time in which to make application for 1937 licenses."

"Please notify every motor vehicle operator in your respective district who is operating a vehicle with 1936 license or with none at all to immediately make application for license plates for the year 1937."

According to the law, motorists who operate with obsolete licenses are liable to arrest and fine.
