

### Three Day Garden Institute to Be Held in Evanston

A three day Garden Institute sponsored by the Garden Associates, of which Mrs. Roy L. Davis is chairman, will be held at the Woman's Club of Evanston, February 24, 25 and 26. Professors Joseph G. Blair and Max G. Fuller of the University of Illinois have assisted Mrs. Fenton Kelsey, chairman of the institute, and Mrs. Davis is planning the program.

Mrs. Edward L. Scheidnfeld, member of the Wilmette Garden club will speak at the opening session Wednesday, Feb. 24, at 10:30 on "Evergreens for This Climate and Their Care." At luncheon Mrs. William C. Evans of Evanston will discuss "Dish Gardens" and show several examples of this attractive art. Mrs. Evans, who is a member of the club, has studied art and horticulture for many years and has made a particular study of Japanese flower arrangement. With Mrs. John Healy she won the silver medal of the Garden Club of America for an herb garden two or three years ago at the Navy Pier. For the afternoon program at 2:00, Margery Carlson, the assistant professor of botany at Northwestern, who has made some notable experiments with domestic orchids recently, will give an illustrated lecture on "Wild Flowers." She will explain how best they may be brought into the home garden.

On Thursday the 25th at 10:30, C. C. Compton, entomologist of the Illinois State Natural History Survey connected with the University of Illinois, will lecture on "Insecticides and Their Use in the Control of Pests and Diseases in the Garden." Mr. Compton has done research work in the control of insects for the last fifteen years and for the last ten years his attention has been directed particularly to the Chicago area. The speaker for the luncheon program has not yet been announced. That afternoon at 2:00 J. H. Hanley, scientific assistant in the department of floriculture at the University of Illinois, will discuss "Annuals," telling of the worthwhile varieties and their use in the garden at evening program when ticket holders may bring one guest. Mrs. M. L. Fuller will present an illustrated lecture entitled "Your Home and Your Garden." Mrs. Fuller has studied at Oxford university and is a special lecturer at the Universities of Iowa and Illinois. It is said that no garden institute is complete without her services.

The program for the final day opens with a lecture at 10:30 by M. G. Fuller, extension specialist in landscape gardening at the University of Illinois and son of Mrs. M. L. Fuller. His subject will be "Planning for Color in the Garden in Spring, Summer, and Fall." At luncheon there will be another interesting speaker, at 2 o'clock G. L. Pierce of the University of Illinois will talk on "Saving Our Trees," a timely topic for all nature lovers. Individual course tickets may be had for a moderate cost or garden clubs may purchase a group ticket which will admit any number of their members. Reservations for each luncheon must be made at the club office by 5:30 p.m. a day in advance.

### New Officers of T. B. Association Elected Thursday

The annual meeting of the Lake County Tuberculosis association was held in Waukegan. Dr. Benj. Goldberg of the University of Illinois was the guest speaker. Mr. W. P. Shahan, executive secretary of the State Tuberculosis association was among the 64 who attended the luncheon.

Dr. Goldberg explained the three types of institutions which render care to tuberculous patients. They are (1) general hospitals which offer surgical facilities, (2) convalescent homes, and (3) custodial institutions for far-advanced cases. He stressed the importance of getting able men appointed to the Sanatorium Board for they would have complete charge of the sanatorium if it is built.

Following the luncheon, the board of directors elected the following officers for the coming year: Dr. E. H. Smith, president, Dr. Theo. Proxmire, vice-president, Mrs. Austin Niblack, vice-president; Mrs. Gerard

Fossland, secretary; and Harry A. Hall, treasurer. New members of the board are Mrs. Howard Detmer of Highland Park, Mr. Edgar Stephens of Zion, and Mrs. Earl Kane of Mundelein.
