

"Oftentimes sloughs and ponds in this section are frozen over by early November, and there is no duck hunting left," stated Earl L. Keeney, president of the Sportsmen's group. "It is to seek a fairer distribution of the season and to afford all hunters of the state an even break, that the Elgin meeting has been called. All sportsmen who question the fairness of the present arrangement as to legal hunting dates, should attend and state their case."

This game maintained the local's hold on a tie for third place in the Suburban league with Morton.

After leading at half-time 19-13, the Evanston varsity staged a "sitdown" game in the third quarter. The Evanston crew tossed the ball among themselves in mid-court for the entire period while the crowd hooted for action. Not until the last quarter when Highland Park shifted to a man-to-man defense did anyone so much as risk a shot at the basket. The score was close most of the way, though. Evanston was never caught with less than a three point margin. The final count was 31-20.
