With the return of the Lenten season the homemakers again is searching for attractive suggestions for meatless dishes to serve during this period. Old friends are said to be the best friends, and so we feel the same way toward old favorites such as macaroni and cheese, with a new twist to its preparation, or a new accompaniment with it, this old favorite will gain new friends with every entrance on the meatless days of the Lenten season.

If you wish to win the admiration and praise of your family for serving a Lenten dish than can truly be called a culinary triumph, just jot down the following recipe.  
**Macaroni with Cheese Wine Sauce**  
4 cups cooked macaroni  
1 medium onion, minced  
2 tbs. butter  
1/2 lb. creamy mild packaged yellow cheese  
2 medium tomatoes, or 1/2 cup tomato juice.  
2 tbs. minced green pepper.  
2 hard cooked eggs.  
1/2 cup domestic sherry wine  
Cook until tender, but not browned, the onion green pepper, sliced tomatoes or tomato juice with butter. Combine with the cooked macaroni and sliced hard - cooked eggs and place in baking dish. Melt in the top of a double boiler the cheese, when soft add the sherry wine and mix well. Pour the cheese wine sauce over the macaroni mixture. Bake 30 minutes in moderate oven—350 degrees F. Serviced 8.

**Macaroni and Fish Croquettes**  
2 cups flaked fish  
2 cups cooked macaroni  
1/2 cup thick white sauce  
1 small onion, chopped fine  
1/2 cup bread crumbs  
2 eggs  
1 teas. salt  
Add the salmon or other flaked fish, macaroni and onion to white sauce. Let stand until firm. Shape into croquettes. Roll in the beaten egg and then in bread crumbs. Fry in deep fat.  
**Macaroni Leaf with Mushroom Sauce**  
1 cup uncooked macaroni, elbow  
1 1/2 cups milk, scalded

**Blushing Bunny**  
This delightful dish may be served during lent when you have a few guests over for the evening.  
1 1/2 lbs. young American cheese (cut in small pieces)  
2 cup tomato puree  
1/2 cup chopped stuffed olives.  
Heat tomato puree, add cheese, stir until cheese melts and is smooth. Add olives. Serve on crackers or toast triangles.

### Plan to Collect Delinquent Tax on Personal Property

Justices of the peace of the 18 townships in the county met at the county building, Waukegan, yesterday, with the delinquent tax committee of the board of supervisors and State's Attorney Charles E. Mason and Assistant State's Attorney Okel E. Fuqua to consider methods to be used to collect delinquent personal property taxes.

The chief aim of the delinquent tax committee, composed of Supervisor Emmett Moroney, Charles J. Herschberger and O. J. Boehm, is to collect taxes from property owners who are able to pay.

Nearly 10,000 of the 16,000 personal property owners in the county listed by the assessors of the 18 townships are delinquent from one to nine years.

A card index system for the various townships was prepared by the staff of County Treasurer Allen J. Nelson at the request of the board of supervisors. These cards will be placed in the hands of the justices.

The plan worked out by the delinquent tax committee for the collection of these delinquent taxes is to send in letter to each of the delinquents informing him that suits will be started in justice courts for the delinquent taxes.

Payments will be accepted for a time before court procedures are started. If, after a reasonable time, no effort is made by the delinquents to meet the tax obligations, summonses will be issued through the justice courts.

Most of the delinquents, members of the board of supervisors have contended, are able to meet the tax obligations, but have either neglected to make the payments or have wilfully passed up paying.

The delinquent tax committee has indicated that it is not going to force collection of delinquent personal taxes from families on poor relief or those on WPA work, but will make every effort to collect from those who are able to play.

### Services Are Held for Robert Fagan

Funeral services for Robert Fagan, 51, who passed away in Waukegan, Wed. night, were held at 9:30 a.m. Saturday from St. Mary's church in Lake Forest. Interment from St. Mary's was in St. Mary's cemetery. Mr. Fagan was formerly of this city and was employed for a number of years at the Chicago Hardware Foundry, North Chicago.

Chilled, diced oranges mixed with pineapple and sprinkled with coconut makes a delicious dessert. Boiled rice well seasoned and served with creamed salmon or shrimp makes a good luncheon dish. Dry cake crumbs sprinkled over the top of custards before putting into the oven to bake give the top a delicate brown and the custard a different flavor.
