Illinois Education Association Favors Amending of Bills

Senate Bill No. 1, to create a state board of education, should be amended according to the Illinois Education association, removing certain powers given to the proposed board of education by the bill. Mr. R. C. Moore, executive secretary, today stated that the Illinois Education association had long favored the creation of a state board of education. He expressed the hope that Senate Bill No. 1 would be amended, removing the objectionable features. He pointed out that the chief need of a state board of

education in Illinois is to investigate school conditions and report them, with recommendations for improvement, to the legislature. The Illinois Education association opposes giving to the proposed state board either legislative or executive powers.
