Lincoln grammar school, Highland Park, is the predominate elementary school with eight graduates in the first twenty-eight, closely followed by Elm Place with seven. Oak Terrace with four is next, followed by Ravinia and Wheeling with two each, and West Ridge, Northbrook, Immaculate Conception (Highland Park), and Roosevelt (Burlingame, California), with one each.

For the second consecutive year both valedictorian and salutatorian have been girls. This year the first boy, Anders Husted, is in seventh place. Both Verna Mae Gossweiler and Joan Wichman are from the City of Highland Park, Verna Mae having been graduated from the Elm Place grammar school and Joan, from Lincoln.

Those twenty-eight students, representing the first seventh of the senior class, will be accepted by almost any college in the country without examination. They are to be congratulated on their good work.
