"Don't Tell the Wife." Cast: Una Merkel, Guy Kibbee, Thurston Hall, Lynne Overmaw, Thursday, Friday, April 1, 2. An amusing comedy. The story offers an excellent illustration of the way in which promoters prey upon the ignorant and the simple. The actors are well adapted to their parts and the direction is good. Adults.

This delightfully amusing farce is so well produced, so perfectly cast and so finely directed, that it ranks with the very best in light adult entertainment. Miss Mary Egan to Speak at D.A.R. Meet

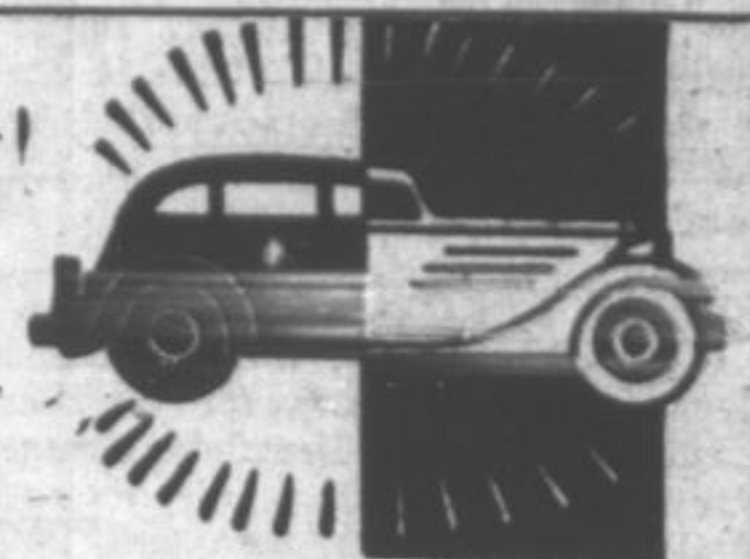
