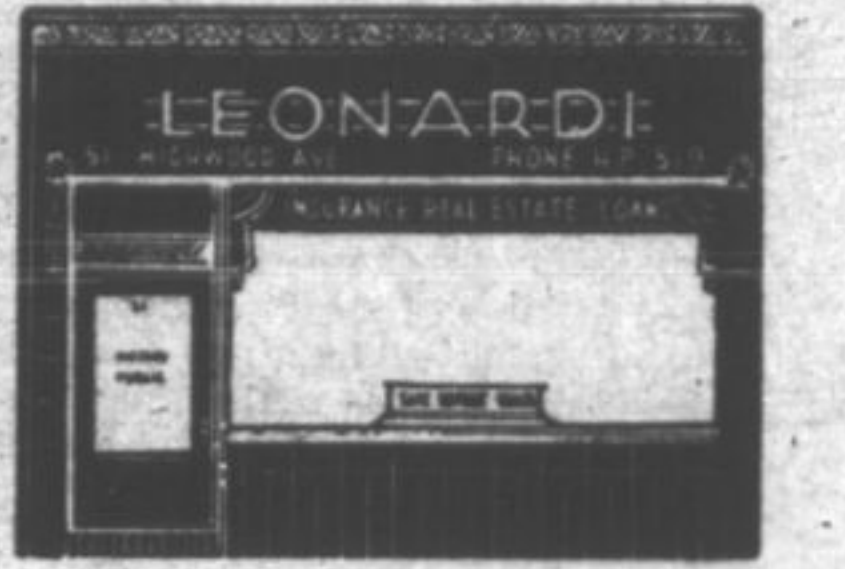
THE BREATH OF SPRING
