Advices Adjustment Of Family Car As Accident Preventive

Now that spring is here, a thorough adjustment of the family car by a competent mechanic is timely and will prevent death or injury to hundreds of persons, Secretary of State Edward J. Hughes informed motorists today in a safety bulletin issued in the interest of public safety.

Secretary Hughes urged dealers, and service station attendants to encourage regular attention by car owners to maintenance of their cars and to frequent examination of brakes.

"Cars which have been in storage all winter and those used infrequently during the cold months are almost certain to need adjustment," Secretary Hughes declared.

"Even cars which have been in constant use should be inspected," he explained, pointing out that "radical temperature changes of winter cause steel to contract and expand until bolts become loosened and the more delicate parts are worked out of adjustment.

"Tires should be inspected for defects," he said. "Air pressure within them is likely to be higher in the spring and summer, due to warmer weather, causing them to blow out. Brakes should be adjusted, wheels aligned, lights focused and steering apparatus checked.

"Proper lubrication also plays an important part in the safe operation of vehicles," Mr. Hughes continued. "Easy steering is largely a matter of using the right grease in the steering apparatus. Oil saturated brake bands are usually caused by improper lubrication."

Mr. Hughes said that an inspection of cars involved in the more than a million accidents reported in the United States last year, disclosed that five per cent of them were mechanically defective. Two per cent of these accidents were directly attributed to defective vehicles.

Spend Week-End in Training

This past week-end was devoted to training of Scout Leaders in the North Shore Area Council and the three neighboring councils and three separate courses of Scout Leader instruction were presented to about sixty men from the Evanston, Oak Park, Northwest Suburban and North Shore Area Council. Important addresses were given by the following men: Stanley Miller of the Chicago Field Service Department, George Schnier, Field Executive of the Chicago Council, S. J. Duncan-Clark, Editorial Writer for the Chicago Daily News, E. M. North, Dean of Boys at the Maine Township high school, Frank Bacon, Principal of the Evanston High school, and Clarence Hardy, Principal of the West School in Waukegan.

Camp-O-Rees to Be Held Soon

The Camp-O-Rees, the inter-patrol camping competitions in the various sections of the North Shore Area Council will be held on May 22 and 23 and on May 29 and 30. The Council Camp-O-Ree will be held at the County Line Forest Preserve on June 5-6. Patrols, camping under their own leadership and without the guidance of the Scoutmaster on the camp site will demonstrate their camping ability and be judged on all of the various points of patrol and Scout camping. Field events in Scout subjects will test the Scouting knowledge and skills of the patrol members.

The program that has been planned for the men will be varied and interesting and includes recreational activities led by Bob Townley and also tours of the campsite and inspection of the equipment and grounds. The men will stay in camp till about ten o'clock on Sunday morning when they will leave for the return trip to the North Shore.

Time for Shore Jamboree Applications

The time for the filing of Jamboree applications is getting short and the National Council is asking that if at all possible applications should be filed by the 15th of May. Any Scout who is planning to attend the Jamboree at Washington should see that his application is in to the Scout Office at the very earliest convenience. The Jamboree will attract about thirty-three Scouts from the North Shore Area Council, making one full Troop.

The games course has contained many types of games and contests for Scouts and the men have enjoyed the three sessions with Bob a great deal. Mr. Townley has had 27 years experience in Scout leadership and has been in the physical educational field for over twenty years.
