8. ANNUAL FLOWER GIVE ADDED BEAUTY

Let me remind you of a few fundamentals that folks often overlook in laying out their flower borders. The first of these fundamentals is that flowers should be massed. They looked a lot more striking when they're planted in beds and clumps, a number of the same variety together, rather than in long thin lines or scattered here and there.

Prepare Seed Bed
Make sure that your soil is neither very sandy nor too heavy with clay, and pulverize it very thoroughly before planting. Flower seedlings are so tiny that they just can't get along in a cloddy soil.

As for how to plant different varieties of flowers, it's a god idea to buy well-known, reliable brands of seeds, and follow the directions on the back of the package carefully.

Most Annuals Sun-Lovers
Quite a few folks have had bad luck with their annuals because they forgot one fact—that most of these flowers need a lot of sun.

Here's an interesting fact about flowers. For some reason, it tires flowers to form mature seeds, and once you let the blossoms wither on the plant and go to seed, the flowers are likely to stop blooming.
