Shrimp Sandwiches 24 slices of white bread, buttered 1/2 cup cooked chopped shrimp 1/2 cup diced celery 1 tbs. chopped pickle 1/2 cup mayonnaise 1 teas. lemon juice, Arrange slices of bread in pairs, spread with rest of ingredients, which have been combined. Arrange sandwich fashion and cut of crusts.

Stuffed Pimientos 1 cupful whole shrimp 1 tbs. chopped onion 1/2 cupful chopped celery French dressing Sliced beets 6 small canned pimientos 1/2 cupful mayonnaise Mix shrimp, chives, and celery with mayonnaise. Fill pimientos with the shrimp mixture and top with a slice of beet that has been marinated in French dressing for 1/2 hour.
