"You Can't Take It With You" Most **Misquoted Title**

Although "You Can't Take It With You," the Pulitzer Prize comedy now in its fourth month at the Harris theatre is one of the biggest box-office hits Chicago has had in recent years, and calls for it come in continuously over the telephone and at the box-office, the title of the show comes in for constant misquoting. About one out of every five calls for "You Can't Take It With You" has the name wrong.

Incidentally, "You Can't Take It With You" will hold three holiday matinees over the Decoration Day week-end; on Saturday, May 29, on Sunday, May 30, and on Monday, May 31. This is practically a record for continuous matinees. They are being held particularly for the out of town visitors expected in Chicago over the holiday.

The most popular wrong title seems to be "You Can't Get Away With It," probably because so many people use that phrase in everyday crusts. conversation. Another favorite query is for "Come and Take It,"

"You Can't Take It With Me" "You Can't Happen With Me" "Take It Or Leave It" "You Can't Take It Away"

"Take It Away With You." 
