Congressmen Honor Gen. J. A. Logan

The Illinois Congressmen stated that they had come to General Logan's tomb for the specific purpose of paying their respects at this time to the Civil War Commander, who 70 years ago issued a famous order which General Logan stated was "the proudest act of my life."

In this order said Congressman Reed General Logan designated the 30th day of May as a day for "the purpose of strewing with flowers the graves of comrades who died in defense of their country during the late rebellion and whose bodies now lie in almost every city, village, hamlet and churchyard in the land."
