As a young woman of 17 she came to Chicago with her parents and lived on the near north side for many years. In 1910, she with Mr. and Mrs. H. Ritchie, came to Highland Park where she resided until her death on Monday.

The deceased was very quiet and unassuming in her manner and consequently did not form a large circle of friends. She dearly loved her home, and was very devoted to those who were near and dear to her. She gave a great part of her life in helping to care for her invalid mother, who passed on in 1905. It was her nature to be generous, she shared liberally with her loved ones and always was very thoughtful of those with whom she came in contact. Those who have known her most intimately have indicated that the one thing that they will always remember about her, is the spirit of unselfishness that so definitely characterized her life. She was vitally interested in good music and the things that are beautiful.

Miss Irwin was privileged to enjoy good health throughout most of her life. She was somewhat handicapped during the past few years of advancing age, but was not seriously ill until about three months ago. She leaves to mourn one sister, Mrs. Mary Virginia Ritchie of Highland Park, one brother, John B. Irwin, of New York City, one niece, Mrs. Hazel Douglas, other relatives and friends.

Funeral services were held at the Kelley chapel, Wednesday at 2 p.m. with Rev. H. F. Siemsen of Bethany church, officiating. Interment took place at Graceland cemetery.
