

**BOB O'DELL WILL PARTICIPATE IN AIR SHOW, JULY 4, 5, AT SKY HARBOR**

Well-known air ace will perform in the Second Annual Air Show at Sky Harbor Airport, Northbrook, Illinois, Sunday and Monday, July 4 and 5. O'Dell is a versatile stunt pilot who can "double" for any star in air shows. Taking part in the following events with Capt. Arthur J. Davis in the air show programs and exhibitions. Spiral dives with smoke, aerial dog fights, race formation flying, and dual stunting with smoke. Bob O'Dell will also be featured in a 10,000-foot delayed opening parachute jump. O'Dell plunges through the air for a mile before releasing his parachute and floating to the ground. Many noted stunt flyers will be featured at this air show under the auspices of Great Lakes Chapter of the N.A.A.

**Waterfront Model for Exhibit**  
A scale model of the waterfront at Camp Ma-Ka-Ja-Wan is being constructed to be taken to the National Jamboree at Washington next week. The model is complete in all details and clearly shows the organization and arrangement of a complete Scout camp swimming area. The waterfront at Camp Ma-Ka-Ja-Wan was designed from recommendations made by Fred C. Mills, national director of health and safety of the Boy Scouts of America and because of its completeness the North Shore Area council was asked to prepare the model for the National Jamboree exhibit.

**D. A. R. BETTER FILMS REVIEW**

**Feature No. 1**  
"The Crime Nobody Saw." Cast: Lew Ayres, Ruth Coleman, Eugene Callette, Benny Baker, Thursday, June 17. Three play wrighters in search of an idea for a murder mystery, on the writing of which there is a time limit, accidentally stumble upon a real crime that spurs their flapping wits. The musical manner in which the story is developed holds the interest despite the many improbable situations which invest all the proceedings with unreality. Adults and young adults.

**Feature No. 2**  
"Too Many Wives." Cast: Anne Shirley, John Morley, Gene Lockhart, Thursday, June 17. A series of patchy ideas, unmatched for absurdity, constitute the story material of a slap stick farce in which the humor is of very poor quality. Both acting and direction are amateur. Family.

"Nobody's Baby." Cast: Patsy Kelly, Lyda Roberti, Lynne Overman, Robert Armstrong, Friday, Saturday, June 18, 19. Hilariously funny farce. The picture is exceedingly well directed and ably cast, with Patsy Kelly and Lyda Roberti combining their talents in a refreshingly new comedy duo. Family.

"The Woman I Love." Cast: Paul Muni, Miriam Hopkins, Lois Hayward, Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, June 20, 21, 22. Based upon a French story, "L'Equipage" by Joseph Kessel. The plot is projected against the tensely dramatic background of the World war. The production does not glorify war but rather stresses the devastation and grief brought about through conflict and the obvious reluctance of the soldiers themselves to go on with their efforts. The photography, realistic-direction skillful and genuine liking and sympathy for each member of the tragic triangle is developed. Adults and young adults.

The effort of the Federal government to rid the country of counterfeiters is the basis of this story, the somewhat involved story moves swiftly in the struggle of wits and shows the splendid accomplishments of the Secret Service.
