

Nationally Famous Tennis Player to Play at Skokie Club

Mrs. Marjorie Gladman Van Ryn, ranked No. 7 nationally, will play in the Illinois State tennis tournament to be held at the Skokie Country club, Glencoe, from June 28 to July 4. Marriage to John Van Ryn, stalwart Davis Cup player, has not halted the tennis career of Marjorie Gladman who has been ranked in the first ten of this country every year since 1928. For the last two years she has won a position on the Wightman Cup squad, the highest honor a woman player can gain.

That Mrs. Van Ryn who will come from Austin, Texas, will have opposition to bring out her best form is indicated in the presence of Catherine Wolf and Helen Fulton in the Illinois State also. Both Miss Wolf and Helen Fulton are national ranking stars whose games are capable of forcing Mrs. Van Ryn to unleash her best shots to win.

Evelyn Bouscarel, Virginia Winston, Bill McConnell, Lucy Jane Hedberg and Al Winston are some of the North Shore players who will also enter.

Wilmer Allison, former national champion, may not have been warned by a soothsayer but dark young men may be a hazard to him during the Illinois State. California is sending a contingent of sun browned netters any one of whom may be of the stuff that Davis Cup men are made.

John J. Moreno, junior singles and doubles champion of California, Louis Wetherell and Jack Knemeyer, intercollegiate doubles champions of the Sunbelt state, Myron McNamara, junior doubles finalist and Jack Hall of the University of Southern California are some of the Pacific Coast entrants. Frank Kovacs, tall, dark and decidedly proficient as his string of championships attests, will probably play with Lloyd Budge, brother of famed Don Budge, in doubles. Kovacs is hailed as an

outstanding prospect for national laurels.

Don Leavens of the University of Southern California is coming as well as representatives from Stanford, the University of California and the University of Texas.

Turning Corners Develops 'Peeves' Among Auto Drivers

How many drivers of motor vehicles know the correct way to turn a corner at an intersection? Or, knowing how, proceed to make the turn properly?

Going around curves and making right-angle turns at intersections are two driving courtesies and regulations to which little attention is paid by most motorists. What a "peeve" they generate! There are correct—legal—ways to turn a car in such places, but most people think only of themselves, their own convenience, with no thought of the "other fellow," says the Illinois Automobile club.

To make a right angle turn at an intersection, the Illinois Traffic Code says:

The driver of a vehicle intending to turn at an intersection shall do as follows:

(a) Both the approach for a right turn, and a right turn, shall be made as close as practical to the right-hand curb or edge of the roadway.

(b) Approach for a left turn shall be made in that portion of the right half of the roadway nearest the center line thereof.

A signal of intention to turn right or left shall be given not less than the last 100 feet traveled by the center line thereof.

1. Right turn—Hand and arm extended upward or moved with a sweeping motion from the rear to the front.

There are the rules, as laid down by the law. In other words, when making a turn at an intersection, a motorist is not expected to turn from the wrong lane immediately in front of other traffic, causing a shrieking of brakes, skidding of cars and possible wrecks, while he nonchalantly drive on. If actual damage is done, this careless driver may come in for some rather disagreeable experiences in court—if any one happens to think in time to get his license

number before he disappears.

Now, as to going around curves. Every one knows the old geometry theorem—a straight line is the shortest distance between two points—or something of that sort. That "shortest distance" seems to be the idea of most motorists when rounding a curve—make it as short as possible from one curb to the other, no matter who or what may be in the way. Such a thing as cutting in front of another vehicle and endangering it and its occupants is of no consequence. Only the shortest way to get around.

"Wrong driving in turning corners or rounding a curve is not only violating the law, but isn't good form, it isn't courteous and just isn't done by the best drivers," comments Carl A. Barrett, president of the Illinois Automobile club.

"Some day the police will 'crack down' on these fellows—and what a lot of them there will be to 'crack.' In the meantime, motorists can save themselves a lot of trouble if they will just remember that there are others on the road and show just a trifle of courtesy. Why be a boor?"
