was not clearly understood because it resulted in an organized protest of many who claimed that it imposed expense to them, that it would too greatly change their landscaping or as in some instances that they serious. All of which may have been true but as the correction of any one condition is only to be had through cooperation and with each making a personal effort the resulting compromise to trim all shrubbery has resulted in even greater growth during the past few years. Chief of Police Edw. Moroney advises that the police department is most willing to help if need be in enforcing the existing ordinance, but realizes that enforceability to a large extent depends on favorable public sentiment.

The majority of accidents during the past year have been due to obstructed vision and unfortunately most of these involved children. The number of these clearly indicates the need for attention and the safety committee urges that everyone begin now before school begins by first correcting any condition on their own property, and then interesting neighbors and hedging to own organizations. Through the efforts of the safety committee much of the shrubbery at the grade crossings has been cut or taken out and with public support the balance of the condition will be rectified. Commander Wm. Heinrichs of the American Legion who sponsors of the safety committee promises the full support of the Legion and it is suggested that report covering any special condition be sent the committee for attention.
