of nourishment or severe injuries to the trunk, can hardly ever be saved but the same tree, kept free from dead limbs, given plant food containing not less than 10 percent nitrogen, 8 phosphate and 6 percent potash, has all cavities in its trunk cleaned out disinfected and filled, and is by spraying kept free of injurious insect pests, such a tree will quickly respond with a luxurious growth.

With each year additional new pests appear, and the dreaded elm case bearer has reached here from Atlantic states and denuded quite a number of our elms, yet spraying will keep this pest in check.

brous roots has been transplanted with a ball of soil a large hole back filled with good soil, is hardly ever as much in need of additional feeding as a native tree grown from a seed dropped on the surface of the ground and as stated above, deprived of leaves gathering under brush should receive, whenever possible, a good dressing of rich soil or be fed with a suitable plant food of which several good brands are now on the market.

Pruning Trees
The only time a maple should be pruned is during summer in fact this holds good with practically all trees, its during August and September most trees have finished their years growth and if to be thinned out or have their dead wood removed this can be done while the foliage is still on the trees. No tree should carry dead wood, to allow this is like permitting cobwebs on the ceiling and corners of the living room, besides dead or partly decayed wood on a tree usually breathes fungi and scale.

Cavities in Trees
The life of trees with cavities in the trunk or branches or injuries to the bark may greatly be prolonged if attended to in time, such injuries will not only ultimately kill a tree but if allowed to remain will form breeding places for troublesome insect pests.

Much of the trouble in obtaining a fair stand of grass below trees on a lawn could be overcome if the clay soil surrounding trees would receive a heavy layer of soil consisting of good loam and well decomposed manure.

Spraying Trees
All trees, you think well of, should be sprayed several times during the year. The State Agricultural department compels every nurseryman
