**Find Body of Lucille Veeck; Seek Companion**

The body of Miss Lucille Veeck, 24, of 3711 N. Richmond avenue, Chicago, who was drowned Saturday at Long Lake with her sweetheart, Carl Burkhardt, 24, of 650 Barry avenue, Chicago, was recovered early Monday.

It was found by Fox Lake firemen and other volunteers who had been dragging the lake since Saturday night. The rescuers were still searching for Burkhardt's body.

Coroner John L. Taylor was notified of the recovery of the girl's body and set the inquest at Strang's undertaking parlor at Grayslake so that the body could be removed to Chicago for funeral services.

Miss Veeck and her companion went out on a rented boat at about 4 p. m. Saturday. Both were in their swimming suits and apparently expected to swim from the boat.

A search was started and the boat containing a pair of beach shoes and a girl's small bag was found. Supervisor Frank Stanton of Grant township was informed of the drowning and started a search for the bodies.

**Gen. Peyton Is New Commander at Fort**

Brigadier general Philip B. Peyton, formerly commanding officer of the 29th Infantry, Fort Benning, Ga., will assume command of Fort Sheridan and the 12th Brigade August 1.

General Peyton was born in Nashville, Tenn., on January 22, 1881, and was graduated from the Virginia Military institute in 1901.

He was commissioned a 2nd Lieutenant of Infantry, Regular Army, in 1904. He has served in the Philippine Islands and Alaska, as well as at various continental stations in the United States.

During the World war he commanded the 61st Infantry in the St. Mihiel and Meuse-Argonne offensives. During those actions he received the Distinguished Service Medal and the Silver Star for the leadership of his regiment.

Colonel Peyton became a brigadier general August 1, succeeding Brigadier General Thomas W. Darrah, who retired July 31.

**Fort Sheridan to Oppose Park Ridge Reds Sunday, P. M.**

Fort Sheridan will oppose the Park Ridge Reds Sunday afternoon in the third game of the newly organized Fort Sheridan Polo league.

The game will begin at 3:30 p. m. on the north polo field at the army post.

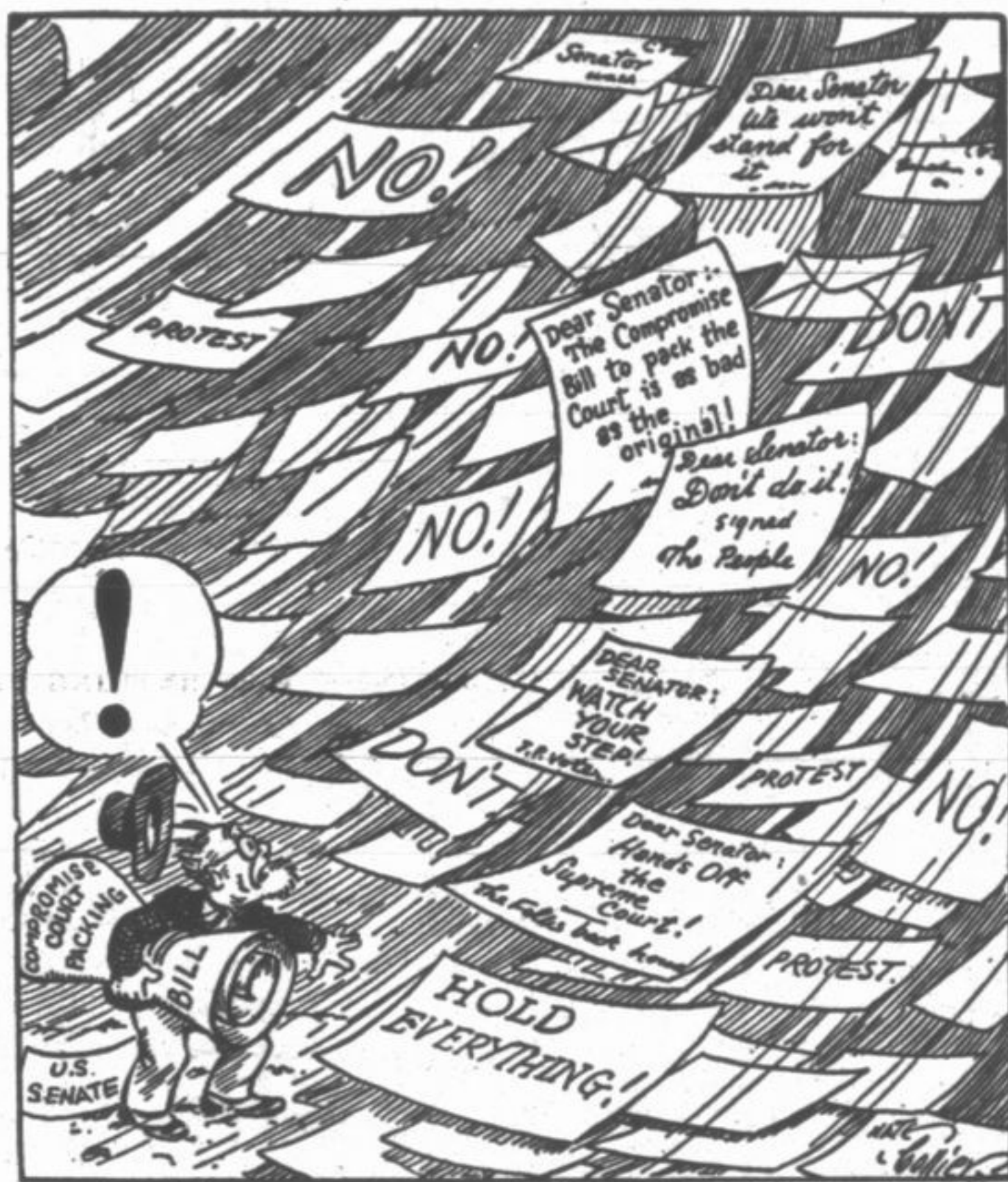

**Do You Know Illinois?**

The Secretary of State of Illinois is the State Librarian. The State Library and Archives Division under his jurisdiction contain much information concerning your State. Any questions which are of particular interest to readers and which are not covered in this series will be answered immediately. Address all communications: Edward J. Hughes, Secretary of State, Capitol, Springfield, Illinois.

**Q. What Vice-president of the United States lived in Bloomington, Illinois?**

**A.** Adlai E. Stephenson. He was Vice-president from 1893 to 1897.

**Q. Where are the graves of Thomas and Sarah Lincoln?**

**A.** Lincoln's father and step-mother are buried in the Shiloh Cemetery, nine miles south of Charleston, Illinois.

**Q. Who built the first trail into Chicago?**

**A.** Gurdon S. Hubbard. This trail was later called "Hubbard's Trace" and in 1834 was made a state road.

**Q. Where is the Marquette-Joliet Memorial Cross?**

**A.** In Chicago. This cross marks the site of Marquette's Cabin, erected during the winter of 1674-1675.

**Q. Where is the oldest agricultural experimental plot in the United States?**

**A.** At Champaign, Illinois. This plot, known as the Morrow Plot, was laid out and planted in 1876.

**Q. Who was the official guide of the Lewis-Clark Expedition?**

**A.** An Indian squaw, As-shaw-equa (singing bird). She died on a Sac reservation on the Kansas River August 29, 1846.

**Q. Is the official language of Illinois, American or English?**

**A.** On June 19, 1923, Senate Bill 15, was passed by the 53rd General Assembly providing that "The official language of the State of Illinois shall be known hereafter as the "American" language.

**Q. How many Archives Buildings are there in the United States?**

**A.** Three. One at Washington, D. C., one at Annapolis, Md., and the third at Springfield, Ill.

**Q. For what purposes is the Fuel Tax used?**

**A.** For highway construction and improvement throughout the state.

**Q. For what purpose are motor vehicle and chauffeur license fees used in Illinois?**

**A.** For retirement of Highway bonds and interest, and the construction and maintenance of state highways.

**Trailer Travel Shows Big Gains**

With special facilities for trailers being provided at most of the national parks, the volume of trailer travel to these playgrounds is showing strong gains, Bert Vanderwarf, head of the touring and travel bureau of the Chicago Motor club, declared today.

"During the one month of August last year," Mr. Vanderwarf said, "nearly 7,000 trailer travelers entered the national parks and monuments. In a special thirty-day survey, the National Park Service counted 1,720 trailers utilizing the park areas, and by means of questionnaires developed interesting information regarding the average trailer user.

"It was found, for instance, that an average of four persons traveled in the trailer-equipped automobiles, and that the party stayed for three days. Of the total number of trailers reviewed, 91.28 per cent were owned primarily for vacation travel and only 8.72 for a permanent all-year dwelling.

"The average cost of the trailers entering the park was \$488.07. Only about 31 per cent of those reported on were taxed and the average tax was \$5.57. Nearly 87 per cent of the trailers were wired for electricity.

"Of the total number of trailer travelers, 44.34 per cent were people vacationing from their jobs; 21.92 per cent were professional men; 3.6 per cent were farmers; 15.23 per cent were retired, and the remaining 15.01 per cent were engaged in miscellaneous occupations."
