Agriculture, announced today. One, a woody-stemmed biennial with white or lavender blossoms, has very narrow leaves and grows in compact clumps. It has an abundance of seed which is easily scattered by the wind. It is a member of the thistle family and has been classified as Centaurea aculosa by Joseph E. Barnes, botanist in the

Division of Plant Industry. Until the new weed was discovered in this state, it was not known to exist west of Pennsylvania. It was found near State Route 2, west of Rockford; and it is believed that this weed was brought to Illinoi


