

### Commissioning of New Naval Air Base to Take Place Aug. 28

The Commandant of the Ninth Naval District, Rear Admiral Hayne Ellis, U. S. Navy, announced today plans for the official commissioning of the new naval reserve air base in Chicago.

The naval reserve air base was recently removed from Great Lakes and established at the Curtiss airport, Chicago, (Glenview). Over one hundred thousand dollars has been spent in improvements to date with further sums contemplated.

The ceremonies will take place the afternoon of Saturday, Aug. 28. Invitations have been extended to prominent federal, state, city and county officials. Governor Horner and Mayor Kelly have been invited as honor guests and for brief addresses.

A colorful ground and air show will follow the brief commissioning exercises during which a salute will be fired. The regiment from Great Lakes will stage a complete review together with its unique flag drill to music. The air show will follow at once, executed by naval reserve planes from the bases at Kansas City, St. Louis, Minneapolis and Detroit in addition to those on duty at Chicago. The planes will simulate firing on towed targets, power dive bombing made famous by the

original "Hell Divers" and squadron expected to participate in these maneuvers.

Admission to the public will be free—ample parking facilities being planned on the field itself.

In addition to the naval reserve air bases in the Ninth Naval District, (the headquarters base being Chicago), there are bases at Boston, New York, Philadelphia, Miami, Long Beach, San Francisco and Seattle. The reserve squadrons at these bases are officered by graduates of the main naval flying school at Pensacola, Florida. Many of the men have had active naval service although opportunity is afforded local civilians to enroll in the aviation reserve. Under present plans considerable expansion in this phase of naval activity will continue for some years.

The opening of the local reserve air base will afford the people of Chicago their first view of all the reserve naval planes of this district, and should serve to acquaint them with their own new naval base.
