Postponed Wrestling Match Promises Feature Show Friday

Postponed from last Friday to this Friday because of rain (the most important wrestling match ever presented in Lake county between Jack Claybourn, the Black Panther of the Northwest, and Jim McMillen, outstanding contender for the world's heavyweight wrestling

championship, will headline another all-star pro mat program in the Round Lake open-air arena.

Hailed as the Joe Louis of wrestling by wrestling promoters and fans everywhere throughout the United States, the sensational colored star is being groomed for a match with the world's champion, and McMillen will be the final and supreme test of the great negro's true ability.

Supporting the main event, but equaling it in talent and color, a semi-windup features a thirty minute limit match between Bobby Burns, sensational blond heavyweight adonis, in his first appearance here in months against the great Iowa scissor's king, Fred Grebmier. Grebmier is undefeated in several straight matches here, and his go with the popular runs should be a real "natural."

Three classy preliminary bouts round out another great card. In one Pat Kelly, Frey Irish sensation, will make his Round Lake debut against "Bully Boy" Jack Kogut,

Canadian heavyweight wrestling champion. Promoters promise fans a real treat in Kelly, one of the finest wrestlers of the day.

Another thriller matches Mike London, bearded California ace, against "Whitey" Wahlberg, handsome blond Milwaukeean. Wahlberg stands only five feet five but is one of the finest of all light-heavyweights and made a big hit a week ago at Round Lake in his match with "Wild Bill" Brooks.

The final match introduces two local youths in their pro debut. One is Howie Day, Abbot Laboratory chemist who has been coaching the Waukegan YMCA and Great Lakes Naval station wrestlers for some time. He will go against Johnny Stanek, husky Libertyville farmer, who shows promise as a wrestler.

Tickets at the usual prices of 50c and \$1.00 plus tax will be on sale all week, and ladies will be admitted free of charge in the ring-side section with escorts.
