

Orchestra Pit Is "Removed" from School Auditorium

Students returning to the Highland Park high school on Sept. 8 will find that a familiar spot in the auditorium—the orchestra and band pit—has been "removed."

As the major improvement effected at the institution during the summer recess, the pit was filled in with concrete at the floor level and four practice rooms constructed below.

These new quarters, which will be used by students in the several musical groups, have been acoustically treated and soundproofed. A ventilating system assures 120 cubic feet of fresh air will be provided every minute.

Last summer the student kitchen in the industrial arts building was refurbished and decorated. This summer workmen dressed the sewing room in bright new colors and installed new furnishings.

Venetian blinds permit the desired amount of light to enter the sewing rooms. The recently-painted ceiling is of a cocoa shade, while the walls are of a light shade of green. And new curtain drops will be put up this week.

Other improvements, according to Frank S. Wichman, superintendent of buildings and grounds, consist of ventilating fans in the cafeteria and adjoining kitchen and the installation of a vacuum system to remove sediment from the bottom of the swimming pool.

Several classrooms in the two main buildings have been redecorated to await the expected record enrollment next month.
