Hold Rites for Oscar Rubin in Chicago Tuesday

Services for Oscar Rubin, 57, president of Rubin's Department store, Waukegan, took place in Chicago at 10 a.m. Tuesday in the chapel at 5145 Broadway.

Mr. Rubin died Saturday noon at Victory Memorial hospital following an emergency appendectomy Thursday morning. Mr. Rubin had suffered from chronic appendicitis over a period of time.

Mr. Rubin made his home at the Waukegan hotel.
