Here are some of the "DISH OF THE DAY" recipes. You'll like them.

**Oysters a la Mexicana**  
Place oysters in a buttered baking dish, sprinkle with cheese and bits of butter. Then cover with a sauce made by combining 1/2 cup of tomato catsup, 1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1 tablespoon butter, and one-fourth teaspoon pepper. Bake in moderate oven until cheese melts and oysters begin to curl.

**Macaroni Virginia Style**  
1 1/2 cups macaroni, uncooked.  
1 teaspoon dry mustard  
1 1/2 cups white sauce  
2 tablespoons butter  
1/2 cup grated cheese  
3 tblsp dried bread crumbs.  
Break macaroni into one inch pieces and cook in boiling salted water fifteen minutes, or until soft. Drain in colander and pour over 1 quart cold water. Put half in buttered baking dish, dot with one-fourth the butter and sprinkle with one-half the mustard and cheese. Repeat. Pour over the white sauce, cover with the dried bread crumbs mixed with remaining butter and bake in a hot oven, 400 degrees F., until crumbs are browned.

**Lamb Roll, Marquise**  
5 lbs. lamb roll  
1 cup peas  
2 strips bacon  
1 cup cubed carrots  
1/2 cup diced celery  
Flour  
Salt and pepper  
1 bay leaf  
1 teaspoon horseradish  
1/2 cup water  
Wipe roast with damp cloth and rub with salt, pepper and flour. Lay strips of bacon over top of roast and brown in hot oven (500 degrees F.) for 15 minutes. Reduce temperature to moderate (350 degrees F.) and roast until tender (about 2 hours). One-half hour before roast is done, add remaining ingredients and simmer in meat juice until tender. Remove the roast to a hot platter, thicken vegetable sauce and serve with roast, garnish with parsley.

**Brownies**  
2 squares chocolate  
1/2 cup shortening  
1 cup sugar  
2 eggs  
1/2 cup flour  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
1 teaspoon vanilla  
1 cup nut meats.  
Melt the chocolate and shortening together, add the sugar and mix well. Add the well beaten eggs. Sift the flour once before measuring. Sift the flour and salt together and add to the chocolate mixture. Add

the vanilla and nut meats and mix well. Pour into well greased pan and bake 35 minutes in a 325 degree oven. When taken from oven, mark into bars or squares with knife. Remove from pan when cool.

**Spanish Tomatoes**  
Firm medium sized tomatoes  
Spanish onion  
1/2 tablespoon butter  
Salt and pepper  
1 tablespoon granulated sugar.  
Split tomatoes. On each half

place a thin slice of Spanish onion. Season with salt, pepper, butter and sugar. Broil in hot oven until onion is crisp and tomato soft. Allow one-half tomato for each serving.

**Finnan Haddie, Scotch Style**  
1 finnan haddie  
1 teaspoon flour  
1 tablespoon butter  
1 cup milk.  
Cut the finnan haddie in pieces for serving, lay in stewpan with the butter. Cover and allow to steam about 5 minutes. Mix the flour with a little milk, then add rest of milk and bring to boil. Pour over fish and allow to simmer a few minutes. Remove fish to a serving platter and pour sauce over fish. Serves 4.
