Mrs. Gertrude Butler to Conduct Drama Classes at Y.W.C.A.

Dramatics for children will be conducted at the Y.W.C.A. on Saturday mornings throughout the fall and winter by Gertrude Williams Butler, according to plans announced this week by the Education Committee. Mrs. Butler will also direct a Young People's Drama Class and an Adult Drama Class so that all ages may have the bene-

fit of this stimulating new Little Theatre project to be developed as soon all-community interest.

Well known along the North Shore as one of the founders and president of the Ravinia Players, Gertrude Williams Butler has had a variety of experience in directing and acting. She played the lead in "Mrs. Moonlight" when the Ravinia group gave that performance and understudied the lead in "Springtime for Henry" at the Blackstone Theatre in Chicago where she played a minor part. She has been heard in such well known radio programs as "Betty and Bob," "Jack Armstrong," "Skippy," "College Inn Comedy."

Registrations for any of these four groups of drama classes may be made at the Y.W.C.A. now. A term of ten weeks is planned.

1—Dramatic Play Class—for children four to eight years of age, meeting Saturday mornings from 9:30 to 10:30. Nursery rhymes and every-day make-believe will be dramatized to bring out original dialog and characterization. Attention will be paid to the development of poise in elementary social life, and rhythm and pantomime will be studied. For both boys and girls.

2—Creative Drama Class—for grade school girls and boys from 8 to 14, meeting Saturday mornings from 11 to 12 o'clock. Dramatizing children's stories, work on pantomime and rhythm, characterization and voice. Elementary play production will also be covered.

3—Young People's Drama Class—open to high school students. A one hour period is planned for some night after school. This class will cover the main essentials of acting, directing and production with some study of plays.

4—Adult Drama Class—open to

men and women, planned for an evening best suited to the group. This course will cover the same points as the Young People's Drama Class.

These classes are offered not only for those who like to act and have talent but for anyone who feels the need for developing poise and self-confidence. All ages can learn a great deal from working with a group on dramatic problems so the Y.W.C.A. Education feels it is offering a real opportunity in these drama groups.

Other interesting new classes and courses for adults will be announced next week. For this week "the play's the thing." Registration in all groups will be limited so early registration is desirable.

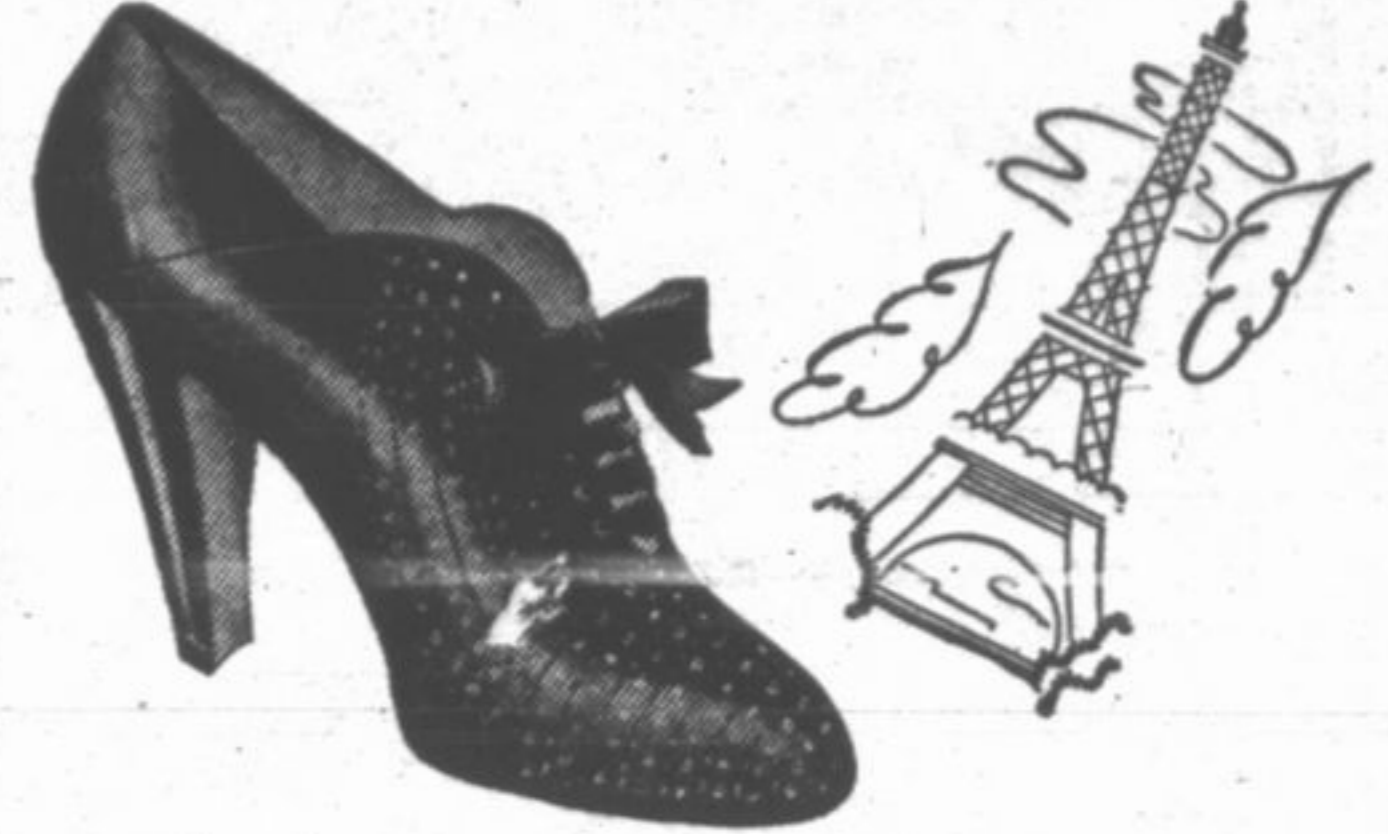
