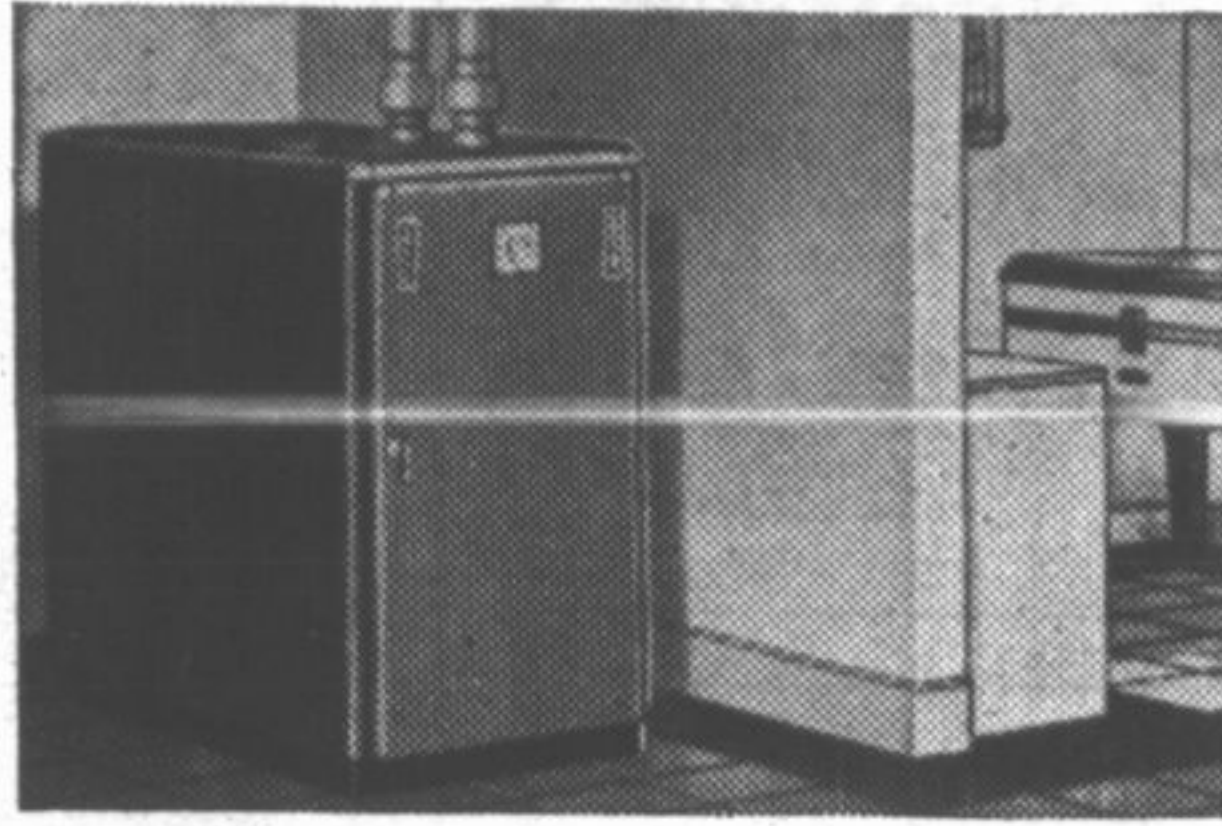
Mr. and Mrs. Henry K. Coale and two sons are moving from the Becker house on Waukegan rd. to Green Bay rd. in Highland Park.

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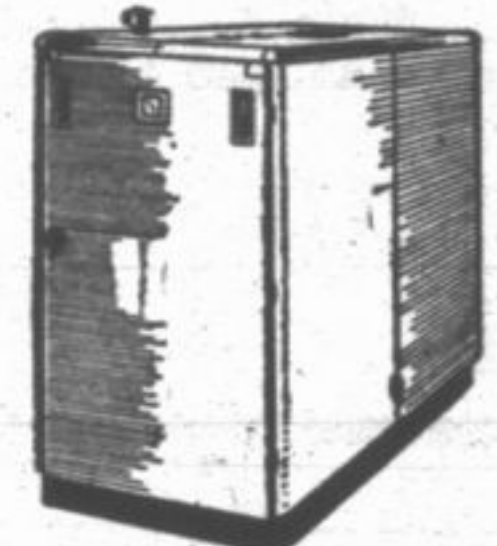
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
